PURPOSE OF OUR CONVENTION

For the 46th time since its founding, the Pacific Southwest District will meet in convention. Each of the 35 districts of the LCMS meet in convention tri-annually* to support the mission of the congregations and schools of the District. A good part of the reason for a convention is found in the purpose for which our Synod was established. We share with you the statement of objectives taken from the Constitution of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. We commend these objectives to you for your study. They help to focus the ministry and mission of our church and from them we will proceed with the agenda.

The Synod, under the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions, shall:

1. **Conserve and promote** the unity of the true faith (Ephesians 4:3–6, I Corinthians 1:10), work through its official structure toward fellowship with other Christian church bodies, and provide a united defense against schism, sectarianism (Romans 16:17), and heresy;
2. **Strengthen** congregations and their members in giving bold witness by word and deed to the love and work of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and extend that Gospel witness into all the world;
3. **Recruit and train** pastors, teachers, and other professional church workers and provide opportunity for their continuing growth;
4. **Provide opportunities** through which its members may express their Christian concern, love, and compassion in meeting human needs;
5. **Aid congregations** to develop processes of thorough Christian education and nurture and establish agencies of Christian education such as elementary and secondary schools, and to support Synodical colleges, universities and seminaries;
6. **Aid congregations**, providing a variety of resources and opportunities for recognizing, promoting, expressing, conserving, and defending their confessional unity in the true faith;
7. **Encourage congregations** to strive for uniformity in church practice, but also to develop an appreciation of a variety of responsible practices and customs which are in harmony with our common profession of faith;
8. **Provide evangelical** supervision, counsel, and care for pastors, teachers, and other professional church workers of the Synod in the performance of their official duties;
9. **Provide protection** for pastors, congregations, teachers, and other church workers in the performance of their official duties and the maintenance of their rights;
10. **Aid in providing** for the welfare of pastors, teachers, and other church workers and their families in the event of illness, disability, retirement, special need, or death.

To pursue these goals, our Synod has divided itself into districts through which a broad range of efforts in mission and ministry are undertaken. Conventions of our Synod and its districts gather every three years and receive reports from elected officers, boards, committees, and task forces. Decisions for action, based on reports, resolutions, and recommendations by congregations, conferences, and others help to determine our joint work for the days before us.

We pray that this convention will encourage and inspire us all to be about our Father's business with great joy and deep commitment.

CONVENTION CONFERENCE SCHEDULE CONSIDERATIONS

Conventions have a certain quality of sameness about them; yet, each one is unique. That is certainly going to be the case for our 46th Regular District Convention.

To help us fulfill the business portion of the convention, we have provided four working sessions. Because our time is limited, every effort will be made to follow the schedule very closely. Please take note of the enclosed schedule that will keep you on course throughout the event.

Reverend Dr. Matthew Harrison, President of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, will preach for our Worship Service. President Harrison has served in this position since 2010. Prior to his election, he served as the President of Lutheran World Relief.

Our worship service will include communion and the District's Jubilarian and Memorial recognition. Here we honor professional church workers who have celebrated significant anniversaries in ministry and those who have died since the last convention.

Also joining us in convention will be The Reverend Dr. Scott R. Murray, the second vice-president and a member of the Presidium of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. He represents the church's West-Southwest Region. Dr. Murray currently serves as senior pastor of Memorial Lutheran Church, Houston, where he was called in 1996.

Convention Conference Objectives

Somewhere between 400–500 official delegates, advisors, and officers are expected to participate in the Convention. To make this experience as meaningful and fruitful as possible for you, we encourage you to be conscientious in your involvement at all the sessions including Friday morning. Promptness, attentiveness, and active participation will go a long way to keeping

you in tune with what is happening. To assist you in your involvement, we want to point out three main focal points of the convention sessions:

REPORTS TO THE CONVENTION

Officers, boards, and committees of the District have submitted reports on activities since the last convention in 2018, included in the *Convention Workbook* (available from the PSD website and convention app). These reports are subject to the evaluation of the Convention through the floor committee.

Please read through the Convention Reports in the Workbook before the Convention sessions begin. It is recommended that you download the Workbook from the website or print it prior to the convention.

OVERTURES

Congregations, district boards, circuit forums, pastors', and teachers' conferences are eligible to present concerns for action to the Convention in the form of an overture. These will be found in your Workbook. Additional overtures which might have arrived too late to be included in the Workbook and will be available to you on the Convention Pages of the PSD website:

www.psd-lcms.org

Each overture is handled by one of the floor committees. On occasion, the Resolution (overture) will be offered for adoption as they appear in the Workbook. At other times, they will be modified or amended for presentation. Opportunity will be provided for you to address the Floor Committee during the Open Hearings, 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday.

On some occasions the recommendation by the floor committee may be that they be declined in their entirety. All Voting and Advisory Delegates are entitled to address the Convention concerning these overtures when they are presented for action.



Voting or advisory delegates may speak to any floor committee report at a microphone on the convention floor. Follow the instructions provided at the convention for entering the queue to speak. Wait to be recognized by the Chair of the Convention, give your name and the congregation you are representing, and then ask a question for clarification or make a comment for or against the issue in question. Any speaker on the Convention floor will be limited to two minutes.

Delegates should be familiar with all overtures before the Convention begins so that they have a clear understanding of the action that is called for and can speak directly to the issues that are involved. Floor committees may provide opportunity for discussion of resolutions in smaller groups before they move for adoption by the Convention. The Chair may call a delegate out of order if it is apparent that the remarks being made are not pertinent to the matter that is before the Convention.

ELECTIONS

The election of officers will be an important activity at the convention. According to the Synod Handbook, all district officers are to be elected at each convention and all terms of office are to be for three years*.

The Nominations Committee has prepared a slate of candidates with biographical data for each of the offices. You will see this in *Who's Who* section of this *Convention Workbook*.

The 2012 Convention of the Pacific Southwest District changed the nominating procedure for the nomination of the President. Each congregation in the District was invited to nominate up to two (2) pastors for District President.

The candidates receiving the three highest total number of nominations, and who are willing to serve if elected, shall be on the ballot for District President.

The biographical information for these nominees, as well as mission and vision statements from the candidates previously published on the District's website, are printed in the *Convention Workbook* for prayer and study by the delegates.

2006 Bylaw changes designated that the members of the Board of Directors be elected by regions.

Regarding excuses for non-attendance, the directive of Synod says that:

All duly elected delegates and advisory members shall attend all sessions regularly. Those who do not attend shall have a written excuse.

Congregations whose chosen lay delegate cannot attend should notify the District office so that the alternate selected may receive proper credentials.

If it is impossible to find representation, a written excuse should be mailed to the Registration Committee Chairperson.

We pray that this Convention Conference will provide information and inspiration to all of us as we meet the exciting challenge that surrounds us in this corner of God's kingdom.

STANDING RULES OF THE CONVENTION

1. The Chair shall ensure that the agenda shall be followed as closely as possible.

2. When recognized by the Chair, members of the Convention shall state their names, and the name of the congregation or of the board or faculty that they represent.



3. Members are limited to no more than two speeches, of a maximum length of two minutes each, on the same question on the same day.

4. A member who has spoken on a question may not, at the close of the speech, move the previous question.

5. In order to promote an orderly and non-distracting convention atmosphere the use of electronic devices by voting and advisory delegates in the convention hall shall be limited. Wired and wireless communication devices, laptops, tablets, mobile phones/smartphones, smart watches or other similar electronic devices may be used but shall have electronic communications capabilities (including Wifi, Bluetooth, cellular, email, text, and social media messaging) turned off or in airplane mode. Relevant electronic documents such as the *Convention Workbook* should be downloaded or printed prior to the convention proceedings. All sound-producing capabilities of any electronic device shall be turned off by all attendees in the convention hall.

Congregations, district boards, circuit forums, pastors', and teachers' conferences are eligible to submit overtures, which shall be published in the *Convention Workbook* or in the *Unprinted Overtures*. Only resolutions derived from overtures so published and proposed by a floor committee shall be considered by the Convention. The floor committees shall review each overture assigned to them and bring it to the floor as a resolution unmodified, modified, combined with other overtures; or with a recommendation that it be declined.

Any delegate desiring to present a lengthy amendment to a resolution or to propose a substitute motion shall, before proposing the change, submit two copies in writing to the secretary except if the proposed substitute is

taken directly from the *Convention Workbook* or the *Unprinted Overtures* for this convention.

NOTES

Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised* shall govern the District in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with our Bylaws and any other special rules of order the District may adopt (*District Bylaws, paragraph 10.1*).

Behnken Rule

If a substitute is made and seconded, the presenter shall be offered two minutes to provide the rationale for presenting the motion. The Convention shall decide by majority vote without debate whether or not to consider the substitute motion. If the decision is in the affirmative and the substitute is subsequently adopted, the original motion fails; if the substitute motion does not receive favorable action either to consider or to adopt, the original motion is again before the Convention (*District Bylaws, paragraph 11.11*).

Substitute Motion

A motion to amend by striking out an entire paragraph, section, or article—or a complete main motion or resolution—and inserting a different paragraph or other unit in its place is called a motion to substitute (*Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 12TH Edition, page 142*).

A member calling of the question from the floor without being recognized does not automatically stop debate. The proper way to stop debate is to be recognized by the Chair and to **MOVE THE PREVIOUS QUESTION**, which motion must be seconded, is not debatable, and requires a two-thirds vote to stop debate (*Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 12th Edition, pages 187-198*).



The motion to **LAY ON THE TABLE** is in order only when there is some other emergency or more urgent business that must be considered immediately, and the intent is to take the motion from the table as soon as the urgent business has been accomplished (*Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 12th Edition, page 198-206*).

Seconding A Committee Motion

A resolution from a floor committee does not require a second (*Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 12th Edition*).

* For the concern and safety of those who would be attending District Conventions, at the end of 2020 the Synod held a national vote asking the congregations for permission to delay, by one year, both the District and National Conventions due to the Covid 19 Pandemic. That vote passed with more than 80% of voting congregations approving the delay.

BYLAWS

1.0 DISTRICT OFFICERS

- 1.1 The district shall elect a president; first, second, third and fourth vice presidents; a secretary; a treasurer; and a circuit counselor/visitor from each authorized district circuit.
- 1.2 The district shall also elect:
 - A Board of Directors
 - A Church Extension Committee Chairperson
 - A committee on Constitutions
- 1.3 Elected Officers
 - 1.3.1 No one in the district, or between the Synod and District, shall hold more than one elective office; or hold more than two offices, although one or both be appointive; or ever hold two office of which one is directly responsible for the work done by the other.
 - 1.3.2 No one shall be elected to more than one district office.
 - 1.3.3 No more than two executive officers shall be elected from any one congregation. The executive offices shall be understood to include the president, the vice-presidents, the secretary, the treasurer, and members of the Board of Directors.
 - 1.3.4 The term of the office for all elected to district offices shall be three years.
 - 1.3.5 The offices of the president, the first vice president, the secretary, and the treasurer of the district shall be without limitation as to reelection.
 - 1.3.6 All other elected officers, members of the board, and elected committee members may serve a total of no more than three successive terms in the same positions.
 - 1.3.7 Any officer, member of the board, or elected committee member may be elected to his previous position after an interval of three or more years.
 - 1.3.8 Any officer or member of a board, ineligible for reelection, may be elected or appointed to any other position.
 - 1.3.9 All new officers, the board, and committees will assume their duties in the second month following the convention elections, and the current officers and the board shall continue to serve until that time.

1.4 Vacancies

- 1.4.1 A vacancy in the office of the presidency shall be filled by the first vice president.
- 1.4.2 A vacancy in any vice presidency shall be filled by advancing the lower-ranking vice presidents. The remaining vacancy shall then be filled by the president from the nominees left after the previous election, according to the number of votes received.
- 1.4.3 A vacancy in the office of secretary or treasurer shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors.
- 1.4.4 A vacancy in the office of circuit counselor shall be filled by appointment by the district president.
- 1.4.5 A vacancy in any other office shall be filled by appointment by the district president in consultation with the appropriate body.

1.4 Procedures for Nominating and Electing

- 1.4.1 All officers shall be elected at each convention.

1.4.1.1 President

1.4.1.1.1 Nominations

- 1.4.1.1.1.1 Six months prior to the District Convention, the secretary of the district will request from all congregations of the district the nomination of up to two ordained ministers from the clergy roster of the Synod for the office of District President.
- 1.4.1.1.1.2 The candidates receiving the three highest total number of nominations who are willing to serve if elected shall be on the ballot for District President.
- 1.4.1.1.1.3 The biographical information of the three nominees as well as mission and vision statements from the candidates will be printed in the convention workbook for prayer and study by the delegates.
- 1.4.1.1.1.4 The election of District President will occur during the first session of the District Convention.

1.4.1.2 Vice Presidents

1.4.1.2.1 Candidates for these offices shall be listed on the Clergy Roster of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

1.4.1.2.2 Vice presidents shall be elected to serve the following regions:

Region 1	Circuits 1-6
Region 2	Circuits 7-11, 17, 20
Region 3	Circuits 12-16, 18, 19, 21-24
Region 4	Circuits 25-32

1.4.1.2.3 Nominations for each of the four regional vice presidents shall be made by the congregations within each region. Six months prior to the District Convention, the district office shall supply to the congregations of each region a list of eligible ordained ministers from within the region for the office of vice president for its region. Each congregation may nominate from this list, and from the entire clergy roster of the Synod, two ordained ministers, and shall provide their names to the district office. The four nominees for each region, who receive the most votes and, who with their consent to serve, consent also be an active member of a congregation of the region if and when elected, shall be placed upon the convention ballot and information about each candidate shall be published prior to the convention.

1.4.1.2.4 Following the elections of the four regions, another ballot election shall be held to determine the positions of the vice presidents. The names of the four vice presidents shall be listed on the ballot in alphabetical order without reference to their regions.

1.4.2 The circuit counselors shall be elected in the following manner:

1.4.2.1 Nominating

1.4.2.1.1 Every voting congregation of each circuit shall nominate as candidates for the office of circuit counselor two men from the clergy roster of the Synod. Nominations may also be suggested by the district president." The nominations shall be made at least six months prior to the elections and shall be submitted to the current Circuit Counselor.

1.4.2.1.2 Selection of 1 = PAGE 34the circuit counselor shall be done in a Circuit Forum convened by the circuit counselor. Each congregation of the circuit sends a pastoral and lay delegate who votes for the circuit counselor.

SECTION 1 – PAGE 34

1.4.2.2 Ratification

1.4.2.2.1 The convention shall have the right to alter the slate by amendment.

1.4.2.2.2 The convention shall then ratify the slate of circuit counselor, which ratification shall constitute election.

1.4.3 The district representative on the Synod's Committee for Convention Nominations shall be elected in the following manner:

1.4.3.1 The District Convention shall elect a representative to serve on Synod's Committee for Convention Nominations.

1.4.3.2 The district will be informed by Synod whether it is to elect a church worker (ordained or commissioned member of the Synod) or a layperson. The alternate should be in the same category.

1.4.4 Board of Regents, Concordia University Irvine shall be elected in the following manner:

1.4.4.1 The district shall elect four members for the Board of Regents, Concordia University Irvine—one ordained minister, one commissioned minister, and two lay persons.

1.4.4.2 Members of the Board of Regents shall serve three-year terms, renewable twice.

1.4.5 The nominating and election procedures shall include the following:

1.4.5.1 Prior to each district convention each regional vice president shall appoint from his region at least two ordained ministers, two laypersons, and two commissioned ministers to stand for election to the District Nominating Committee. The District Convention shall elect from each region one pastor, one lay person, and one commissioned minister who shall serve on the 12-member Nominating Committee for the following District Convention. The committee shall choose its chairperson at its first meeting.

1.4.5.2 The committee shall elicit from all nominees for office, prior to the convention, an indication of their willingness to serve if elected. The slate of nominees, including the qualifications of each person nominated, shall be included in each convention packet, and these materials shall be mailed to each delegate, to each advisory member and to each pastor at least one month before the convention begins.

1.4521 Additions to the slate of nominees may be made from the floor by voting delegates, with the consent of the person so nominated.

1.4.5.3 The president shall appoint a committee of nine members—three pastors, two commissioned ministers, and four laypersons—to conduct and supervise all elections.

1.4.5.4 This committee shall have the privilege of the floor at the discretion of the convention chairman.

1.4.5.5 A majority of all votes cast shall be required to elect. The result of each ballot shall be announced to the convention.

2.0 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

2.1 Shall consist of sixteen members: the president, the four vice-presidents, the secretary, the treasurer, one layperson and one commissioned minister from each region and the chairperson of the LCEF Board.

2.2 Nomination

Six months prior to the District Convention, the secretary of the district will request nominations for all board positions with regional representation being achieved as follows: Each congregation in a region will be invited to nominate up to two people for commissioned minister and up to two lay people from their region. All who are nominated must be a member of a parish in their region. The individuals receiving the four highest numbers of nominations from each region will be placed on the ballot for election by the entire convention.

2.2.1 If an elected member of the board would move out of their region during their term of office, they would resign from the board and a new candidate from the region would be appointed as outlined in the District By-laws.

2.3 The Board of Directors shall:

2.3.1 Develop policies to facilitate the efficient functioning of the district as it carries out its mission.

2.3.2 Be the legal representative of the district and the custodians of all property of the district, and it shall be responsible for the general management of the district, acting on its behalf, between conventions.

2.3.3 Employ an Executive Team Leader to carry out the administration functions of the district according to the policies established by the Board of Directors and under the direction of the district president.

2.3.4 Elect, immediately following each convention, a chairperson from the elected Board members, and meet regularly according to its needs.

- 2.3.5 Approve or disapprove of all appeals for money of a general nature to be made to congregations or individuals, not previously authorized by the district.
- 2.3.6 Keep on file an accurate inventory of all properties, legacies, and other valuable documents of the district.
- 2.3.7 Be authorized to draw upon the district treasury for its expenses.
- 2.3.8 Be accountable to the District Convention for all its transactions. Any decisions of the board may be appealed to the District Convention.
- 2.4 Fidelity bonds shall be provided for the treasurer, the assistant to the treasurer, and other district personnel as determined by the Board of Directors.
- 2.5 The president and the secretary of the district shall be empowered and instructed to sign all legal documents in the name of the district. The treasurer shall be empowered to sign legal documents in the absence of the secretary, and the first vice president in the absence of the president.

3.0 DISTRICT CONVENTIONS

- 3.1 The district president shall be responsible for the organization of the District Convention.
- 3.2 The convention shall meet during the calendar year preceding the year in which there is a national synodical convention.
- 3.3 Convention Expenses
 - 3.3.1 All congregations of the district shall be urged to include in their budgets the convention expenses of their respective pastors, commissioned ministers, and lay delegates.
 - 3.3.2 All congregations of the district shall include in their budgets the assessment for convention general expenses as determined by the Board of Directors.
- 3.4 Reports and Overtures
 - 3.4.1 Reports to the convention by district committees as well as overtures shall be mailed to the district president.
 - 3.4.2 The district president shall assign overtures to convention committees.
 - 3.4.3 The Convention Proceedings shall be maintained as part of the permanent records of the district.

3.5 Convention Committees

Prior to the convention, the district president shall appoint floor committees. The district president shall name the chairperson. Each committee shall select its own secretary from its members.

- 3.5.1 The chairperson of each committee shall arrange for meetings to consider the reports and overtures assigned to it by the district president.
- 3.5.2 Each committee shall consult with the chairperson of appropriate committees, task forces, and staff concerning ministry related to the committee's subject area.
- 3.5.3 Each committee shall submit its report and recommendations to the convention.
- 3.5.4 Additional convention committees shall be appointed by the district president as required.

4.0 DISTRICT CONFERENCES

- 4.1 All professional workers on the Synodical roster shall attend official conferences in accord with synodical regulations.
- 4.2 All congregations of the district shall include in their annual budgets the conference expenses of their professional workers.
- 4.3 Conference for All Ordained Ministers
 - 4.3.1 The Conference for All Ordained Ministers shall meet annually in the fall and be governed by its own procedures and bylaws.
- 4.4 Conference for All Commissioned Ministers
 - 4.4.1 The Conference for All Commissioned Ministers shall meet annually in the fall and be governed by its own procedures and bylaws.
- 4.5 Joint Conference for All Ordained and Commissioned Ministers
 - 4.5.1 A joint Conference for all ordained and commissioned ministers may be called at the discretion of the Conference for All Ordained Ministers and the Conference for all Commissioned Ministers.
- 4.6 Circuit Counselors' Conference
 - 4.6.1 The Circuit Counselors' Conference shall meet twice a year.

5.0 PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, CIRCUIT COUNSELORS, SECRETARY, TREASURER, EXECUTIVE TEAM LEADER, AND REGIONAL MISSION FACILITATORS

- 5.1 The duties of the president, vice presidents, circuit counselors, secretary, and treasurer shall be as outlined in the Synodical Handbook except as supplemented in these Bylaws
- 5.2 The vice presidents shall fulfill their responsibilities as directed by the president.
- 5.3 The executive team leader is responsible for the overall administration of the Pacific Southwest District office, the support, and coordination of the regional mission facilitators. The executive team leader shall work under the direction of the district president. The general duties of the executive team leader are listed in the job description for the position.
- 5.4 Regional mission facilitators will serve groups of congregations, effectively resourcing them to carry out their mission and ministry. These facilitators are accountable to the district president for the administration of their positions.
- 5.5 The regional mission facilitators shall be given calls or contracts with limited tenure of four years by the Board of Directors upon recommendation by the district president.
 - 5.5.1 The positions of regional mission facilitators and executive team leader shall be filled from lists of candidates submitted by district congregations, ~~and~~ members of the Board of Directors and others in the LCMS.
 - 5.5.2 The remuneration package for these positions shall be established by the Board of Directors.
 - 5.5.3 The general duties of the regional mission facilitators shall be as outlined in the job descriptions for these positions.
 - 5.5.4 The job descriptions for these positions shall be prepared by the district president in consultation with the Board of Directors.

6.0 FISCAL OFFICE

- 6.1 Accounting for all district funds shall be under the direction of the treasurer. It shall be the duty of the treasurer:
 - 6.1.1 To maintain all records, which reflect the financial condition of the district at all, times.
 - 6.1.2 To receive all monies for budget and non-budget purposes of the district or Synod and issue receipts for the same.
 - 6.1.3 To deposit all monies in the name of the district in the bank(s) designated by the Board of Directors.

6.1.4 To issue and co-sign checks covering district expenses.

6.1.4.1 Each of the following persons shall be authorized to co-sign checks:

Controller
President
One of the Vice Presidents
Secretary
Executive Team Leader

6.1.4.2 In case of the absence of the treasurer any two of the above shall be authorized to sign.

6.1.4.3 All persons authorized to sign checks shall be bonded at district expense.

6.1.5 To submit all District financial records at least once a year to a licensed and reputable auditing firm as selected by the Board of Directors, or whenever required by the Board of Directors.

6.1.6 To cause the report of the audit(s) to be submitted to the Board of Directors and to the District Convention.

6.1.7 Be the custodian of all the valuable papers, keeping the same under the name of the district in the fireproof vault.

6.1.8 Report regularly to the executive team leader, to the Board of Directors, and to the District Convention on matters of the district budget and finances.

7.0 CIRCUIT FORUMS

7.1 Statement of Purpose

7.1.1 The Circuit Forum shall serve as a setting to review and evaluate programs, plans and long-range directions of the district and the Synod and thus participate in the triennial process of suggesting, developing and attaining the Synod's priorities and goals.

7.1.2 The Circuit Forums shall examine the needs of the congregations within their circuits, and their general community, and relate these needs in a written format to the district president's office, at least two (2) months prior to the district Goal Setting Conference.

7.1.3 The Circuit Forum shall invite the district president, or a member of his staff, to attend one Circuit Forum meeting every three years in order to share the hopes and needs of circuit, the district, and the Synod.

7.2 Organization and Meetings

- 7.2.1 Each Circuit Forum shall consist of one pastor and one lay member from each congregation of the circuit. The circuit lay delegate to the Synodical Convention shall function as an advisory member.
- 7.2.2 Additional officers, as required, shall be elected by the Circuit Forums.
- 7.2.3 The circuit counselor shall ordinarily serve as the chairman of the circuit forum, providing guidance, direction, coordination to the plans and programs, which the forum intends to implement.
- 7.2.4 The Circuit Forum membership shall be elected by the congregations in the year following the district convention.
- 7.2.5 The chairperson of each Circuit Forum shall be the presiding officer of all Circuit Forum meetings.
 - 7.2.6.1 In the absence of the chairperson, the forum shall be empowered to appoint an acting chairperson from its membership.
- 7.2.6 Each Circuit Forum may appoint Standing Committees as needed.
 - 7.2.6.1 As specific needs arise, additional standing committees may be formed at the discretion of the Circuit Forum.
 - 7.2.6.2 Standing committee chairpersons shall be appointed by the chairperson of each Circuit Forum.
 - 7.2.6. These standing committees shall research the needs of congregations in their circuit and implement district programs, or design programs of their own, to meet these needs.
 - 7.2.6.4 The standing committees shall report to their Circuit Forum at each regular meeting.
- 7.2.7 Each Circuit Forum meets as follows:
 - 7.2.7.1 The Circuit Forum shall meet at least four (4) times per year or as often as necessary to plan and carry out its responsibilities.
 - 7.2.7.2 The chairperson shall be empowered to call special meetings as required.
 - 7.2.7.3 Standing committees shall meet during regular Circuit Forum meetings and as often as necessary to plan and implement programs.

8.0 STANDING COMMITTEES

8.1 Committee on Constitutions

- 8.1.1 The district shall elect a Committee on Constitutions composed of two ordained ministers and one layman.
- 8.1.2 All new and revised constitutions of the congregations the district are to be reviewed by this committee, in accordance with the synodical Bylaws.
- 8.1.3 The Committee on Constitutions shall examine the constitution and bylaws of congregations to ascertain that they are in harmony with Holy Scripture, the Confessions and the teachings and practices of the Synod in order that any necessary changes may be made by the congregation before the application is acted upon.
- 8.1.4 If at any time there is a disagreement between the committee and the congregation applying for membership on any scriptural doctrine or Synod policy that cannot be resolved by the district president or Board of Directors, and if the board of directors denies the application, the district president shall submit the application to the next convention of the district (Synod Bylaw 2.3.1 [c]).
- 8.1.5 The committee will also suggest such improvements in congregations and organizations constitutions and bylaws as will better serve the administration of their affairs.

8.2 Mission Committee

- 8.2.1 The Mission Committee shall consist of a representative from each region appointed by the district president in consultations with the region's vice president.
- 8.2.2 The committee shall assist the regional directors and vice presidents in enabling the congregations to carry out the mission activities of each region and the district.

8.3 Church Extension Committee

- 8.3.1 The District Convention shall elect a chairperson who shall be a layperson. The remainder of the committee, as a minimum, shall consist of: one pastor who is currently serving a congregation of the district and one representative from each region. Each is appointed by the district president in consultation with the region's vice president. All appointments are to be subject to consultation with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund vice president for the district.
- 8.3.2 The committee shall assist congregations by approving real estate loans in conformity with the policies of Lutheran Church Extension Fund.

- 8.3.3 The committee shall assist congregations by having developed and implemented a program to encourage individuals and congregations to participate and invest in the Lutheran Church Extension Fund.

8.4 Youth Ministry

- 8.4.1 The committee shall provide planning and leadership for district youth events and training events.
- 8.4.2 The committee shall provide an avenue for youth selected for District LYF (Lutheran Youth Fellowship) positions to be involved in leadership experiences.
- 8.4.3 The council membership:
 - 8.4.3.1 The chairperson shall be nominated by district staff and appointed by the District President.
 - 8.4.3.2 One adult representative each from Arizona, Nevada and California be nominated by the area DCE groups.
 - 8.4.3.3 Six high school youth, selected to district LYF positions at the District Senior High Youth Gathering.
 - 8.4.3.4 Project directors and coordinators, selected by the Youth Committee, to serve as committee chair or coordinators for district youth activities.
- 8.4.4 The committee shall normally meet three times a year.

8.5 Committee on Stewardship

- 8.5.1 The District President shall appoint a District Committee on Stewardship to work in conjunction with the Synod's Department of Stewardship to assist and advise local congregations with the development and promotion of an adequate stewardship program.

9.0 TASK FORCES

- 9.1 Task forces may be developed for specific purposes at the discretion of the district president, regional mission facilitators, Board of Directors, or standing committees. Task forces function under the direction of the person or group that appointed them. The task forces may be regional or for the district as a whole.
- 9.2 Task forces should be chartered with a specific purpose and task, and include a specific ending time.

10.0 PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

- 10.1 The Constitution and Bylaws of the Synod and the rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall govern the district in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the district may adopt.

11.0 SPECIAL RULE OF ORDER

- 11.1 The following special rule of order shall apply to the proceedings in the district:

- 11.1.1 If a substitute motion is made and seconded the presenter shall be offered two minutes to provide the rationale for presenting the motion. The convention shall then first decide by majority vote without debate whether or not to consider the substitute motion. If the decision is in the affirmative and the substitute motion is subsequently adopted, the original motion fails; if the substitute motion does not receive favorable action either to consider or to adopt, the original motion is again before the convention.

12.0 AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

- 12.1 These Bylaws may be amended as follows:

- 12.1.1 At a meeting of the District Convention by a majority vote provided that the amendment has been submitted in the Convention Workbook or in the Unprinted Reports and Overtures for that meeting and the delegates have a minimum of one night to review it. Prior review and approval by the Commission on Constitutional Matters will be required. When prior approval is not possible, actions taken will not become effective until and unless such approval has been obtained.
- 12.1.2 At a meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote upon the express direction of the District Convention to amend the Bylaws to implement a specific resolution adopted by the convention. Prior review and approval by the Commission on Constitutional Matters will be required. When prior approval is not possible, actions taken will not become effective until and unless such approval has been obtained.

PACIFIC SOUTHWEST DISTRICT CONVENTION 2022

DISTRICT PRESIDENT'S REPORT - PART 1

This is the first of two parts of the District President's report that I will present to the convention of the Pacific Southwest District in Las Vegas on June 22-24, 2022. Our theme for the convention is *Abundantly More Than All We Can Ask or Think* and, I'm here to tell you that, since our last convention in 2018, God has definitely done abundantly more than any of us could have imagined!

In this first report I am going to help you understand some of the things God has been doing through the Pacific Southwest District over these last four years and then, at the convention, I will share with you some of the things that we are working on right now, the initiatives and opportunities that are before us.

Purpose

I want to begin by reminding you of the purpose of the Pacific Southwest District: To effectively resource congregations and schools as YOU are connecting people through the Great Commission, proclaiming Jesus to the world, making sure that your church and school environments are healthy, and resulting in people's lives being transformed for eternity. The Pacific Southwest District does not do ministry – you do. It is our job to come alongside PSD congregations and schools, to encourage and support you along the way.

Ministry During COVID

What an incredible four years this has been as we have served together

across the South-western United States, to bring the hope of Jesus Christ to our world during one of the most significant crises any of us have ever experienced. I am so very proud and humbled to have watched the way you have responded during this time of COVID. I remember a Sunday morning, right after the stay-at-home order was issued, when I watched a worship service from one of our congregations on Facebook in which the pastor conducted worship and proclaimed the gospel to the scattered people of his congregation. I saw another picture of that same sanctuary, empty except for the pastor who was in the chancel and his wife who was sitting in a chair at the head of the aisle holding up her iPhone, because it was all that they had to bring the message of our hope in Christ to their congregation. I brought tears to my eyes.

I watched as our schools, in just one weekend, transform from in-class education to online education. I watched as preschool teachers led our youngest in their lessons. (How do you do that online with a preschooler?) It was amazing to see the people of God respond as they worked hard to accomplish things that few knew how to do two weeks before. I watched as school administrators worked with Rachel Klitzing, our Executive Director of School Ministries, to prepare campuses for exemptions so that our schools could open before public schools. We watched as families

brought their children to our schools, resulting in the largest growth in our Lutheran schools than in a generation. I recently spoke with a mom at one of our schools who told me: "We brought our son to this school because the school was open; but he will stay here because no teacher has ever loved our child like this!" I watched as congregations worked patiently with one another and put the needs of others ahead of their own. I saw members provide faithful financial support to their congregations through all kinds of means to ensure the continued advancement of the Gospel. Thank you for the witness and encouragement you are to all of us.

PSD Staff and COVID

Please join me in giving thanks to God for the Pacific Southwest District team, for the way the staff supported, loved, and cared for our church workers as they supported, loved, and cared for their congregations, schools, communities, and neighborhoods. I am proud of our team and their investment of hundreds of hours of Zoom meetings.

- I am grateful for Chief Operating Officer, Jon Niederbrach, who stayed on top of the rules, guidelines, and expectations of three states; for his outstanding knowledge of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and serving as the go-to guy for all the questions you asked.
- Communications Director, Aaron Lucas consulted with countless congregations in streaming worship and identifying equipment

at a variety of price points that made it possible.

- Mission and Ministry Executive, Dominic Rivkin produced video resources to help us navigate through COVID and provided guidance for a variety of ministry challenges. He also partnered with other west coast districts to offer a live streaming conference on Small Church Essentials. (All of these resources are still available on our YouTube channel.)
- Rachel Klitzing met every week with school administrators to coach them through this difficult time. Rachel and her team provided leadership for the first All-Worker Conference in many years. While we were not able to gather in person, almost 1,000 church workers participated in this live streaming event.
- I am equally proud of all our district staff as they went the extra mile to assist you during those difficult days. All of this has positioned us for an exciting new season of service on the mission field of the Pacific Southwest District.

Financial Support During COVID

Our district provided, from our own reserves, almost \$250,000 in financial support to our congregations and schools. We partnered with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod program,

"Soldiers of the Cross" to give \$80,000 in individual grants of \$2,000. These grants were provided to any called, contracted, or hourly worker of our congregations and schools who struggled financially due to COVID. An amazing number of people and ministries were served.

Visitations

Throughout these last four years, I worked diligently to get to know the congregations and schools of the Pacific Southwest District - this was one of my "10 Asks" which I expressed at the 2018 Convention. Thank you for your response and for the many notes and emails I received from individuals across our district who expressed their prayers and gratitude for our shared work. Continuing this effort, I recently completed a visitation trip along Interstate 8 from San Diego to Yuma and Blythe to Lake Havasu City to get to know congregations, their opportunities, and challenges. While COVID interrupted my visitation efforts, I am committed to continue these visits as they are among the most important things I do.

It Takes All Kinds of Churches to Reach all Times of People

I have been a pastor for almost 38 years and, during much of that time, our church body has lived in tension over how ministry and mission ought to be done. I am excited to report that I seldom see that division in the Pacific Southwest District. Our district ministries are experiencing unity, excitement, and a partnership that is humbling. We are learning that God has placed each of us in unique and diverse circumstances

where "it takes all kinds of churches to reach all kinds of people." I want to express my gratitude for your faithfulness in proclaiming what we believe teach and confess, knowing that you faithfully live out the commitments we have made as the people of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Together

The Pacific Southwest District knows how important it is for all of us to work together. We are a district of almost 300 congregations engaged in a common mission to proclaim Jesus in our communities and congregations. We seek to live out the words of Philippians 2 and put the needs of others ahead of our own. This is an important commitment for this time in the church. If we persist in pursuing only our own congregation's needs, we are going to struggle in isolation, and more than a few congregations will close. In contrast, I have joyfully watched five pastors in a circuit of eight congregations make the commitment together to reschedule their worship services to ensure that every congregation has someone to serve them. Congregations that have struggled have been invited by stronger congregations to partner with them for mission and ministry. You will be introduced to examples of these partnerships during the convention.

West Coast Partnerships

Another way that we are working together is through a strong partnership between the three west coast districts:

Northwest, California-Nevada-Hawaii, and PSD. Presidents Linnemann, Lange, and I meet every Monday morning via Zoom to check-in, talk about what's going on in our districts, seek guidance from one another, study Scripture, and always to pray. The Mission Execs from the three districts also meet regularly and have combined efforts for training and seminars.

Mission Training Center (MTC)

The three districts, along with Concordia University Irvine, partner together in offering the Mission Training Center (MTC), now headquartered in PSD after the closure of Concordia, Portland, delivering training for lay people in congregations in partnership with their pastors. MTC is available online for all congregations and districts across the synod. Through MTC, we continue to prepare deacons and parish ministry assistants for service alongside their pastors. When the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod voted in 2016 to discontinue the licensed lay deacon (LLD) program, we were blessed to welcome 20 new pastors in PSD when a pathway was created for LLDs to become ordained pastors through a Specific Ministry Pastor Colloquy program. The need, however, for assistance in many of our smaller and isolated congregations continues to grow. I want to thank Pastor Mark Siegert for serving as director of MTC and for Dr. Victoria Waufle who provides training opportunities and encourages existing deacons and parish ministry assistants in PSD.

Cross-Cultural Ministry

Our district has over 80 congregations that offer ministry in languages other than English. This is a critical area of mission for us to expand as we seek to reach our diverse district with the hope of the Gospel. For some time, we have been benefited from the combined efforts of our Korean pastors meeting together as an affinity circuit to encourage, vision, and pray with one another in their heart language and culture. When, in the last year, we did a reset on Hispanic Ministry in the district, we invited our Hispanic pastors, church workers and lay leaders to follow the example of the Korean circuit and form a special circuit of their own. What a blessing! I invite you to watch the video version of this report and get to know Pastor Ted Kim of our Korean circuit and Pastor Carlos Vasquez from our Hispanic circuit and hear why these special circuits are so important.

Campus Mission Coalition

New to our district since 2019 is the Campus Mission Coalition (CMC). A coordinated and expanding effort, under the guidance of Mission Executive Dominic Rivkin, campus ministry is taking place on the university campuses of University of California, Los Angeles (Pastor Bart Loos), Arizona State University (Ms. Sharon Owens, a former missionary to China), and the University of California, San Diego (Pastor Ben Mai, who just accepted the call to Christ

the King, Newbury Park, CA). One exciting example is the international student ministry taking place at ASU under Sharon Owen's leadership where 700 students (you heard me right!) are engaged in that ministry. We are grateful that God has provided a new way to fund campus ministry in our district.

The Need for Church Workers

A significant opportunity and challenge for our district is the need to secure the very best workers in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod for our congregations and our schools. This is one of the most important things we do at the PSD office. In just the last four years, we ordained 38 brand new pastors and installed 106 pastors in congregations. Our school ministry department assisted congregations and schools to identify, call, and place 185 educators, DCEs, Directors of Worship, etc. We know that, as more pastors and educators retire, this need is going to be even more significant.

The need for workers on the west coast mission field has actually existed for more than 150 years. In 1859, a woman by the name of Mrs. Elizabeth Schreiber of San Francisco wrote a letter to C. F. W. Walther, the first president of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, begging him to send pastors to the west coast. During that time, Walther wrote in synod periodicals that this request was no less a divine call than the one to St. Paul from the Macedonians in Acts 16. In July 1860 a young seminary graduate

named Jacob Buehler packed up his belongs, traveled with his father to New York, got on a steamer and traveled to the eastern side of Panama, took the train across the Isthmus of Panama, got into another boat sailing north, and stepped out into San Francisco on the 26th of August. There he began a mission effort that eventually resulted in the congregations that you and I celebrate and love today in California, Nevada, and in Arizona. It is time for us to pray, like Elizabeth Schreiber, for God to send workers into our part of the harvest field – a Macedonian call for 2022 and beyond. Please be in prayer with us for this critical need in the harvest field. In a previous convention video, I asked you to bring photos of young men and women, teens, maybe a first grader, or a preschooler who have talked about being a church worker. We want to create a photo wall of future church workers, people for whom your congregation is praying. I also want to encourage you to create a fund so that you can help assist them in their future education. This need is only going to get more intense every day as we pray for workers in the harvest field.

Thank You

Finally, I want to say thank you for the encouragement and prayers I have received from all of you. I say it all the time: This is the best job I've ever had, and it is the hardest job I've ever done. Yet, I am confident that our God walks

with me every single day, just the way he does with you. It is my prayer that he will pour out his spirit on your congregation and in your ministries. I look forward to being with you in person at the convention and sharing Part 2 of my report. God bless you!





REPORT FROM REV. DR. RICHARD BURKEY SECRETARY - PSD BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As President Gibson loves to say, *"It takes all kinds of churches to reach all kinds of people."*

In the past 4 years, your Pacific Southwest District Board of Directors has sought to maximize the resources God provides to join Jesus in His mission to build the church.

One Barna research study found that nearly half of U.S. churchgoing Christians (48%) say they are unfamiliar with the term "The Great Commission," while another one in four (27%) says they've heard of this term but can't recall the exact meaning.

100% of the Board of Directors know that the Great Commission is from Matthew 28 where Jesus commissions disciples then and now to go make disciples.

To pursue fulfillment of the Great Commission and to follow the guidance of our abundantly more God, we seek to provide oversight, accountability and encouragement to the district president and his staff's work to ***effectively resource congregations and schools for transforming lives and making the Great Commission REAL!***

Since this board was formed at the 2018 District Convention, President Gibson focused our work on Four PSD Board Policy Outcomes:

1) **Resourcing congregations for health**

Like congregations in our district, COVID presented a unique set of

challenges. In a district that faced government guidelines and mandates over 3 states, we sought to honor the 4th commandment, pray for those in authority, and provide support financially and encouragement faithfully to those who serve in ministry.

2) **Mission planting (birthing congregations)**

Out of the closed and gift to the district of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Norwalk, CA came the Mission Training Center (MTC). The goal of the MTC is equip people to do ministry, to raise up leaders to start missional movements, to see where God will lead and direct our future to build gatherings of disciples.

In partnership with Mission India, 30 church planters were raised up in the India Evangelical Lutheran Church. 4,425 families reached. 334 baptized!

3) **Resourcing leaders for health and effectiveness**

A coaching program was put in place in the past 4 years to assist leaders to coach leaders. An opportunity for those in ministry to get specific coaching outside of reporting mechanisms to district staff. The goal is to train 100 coaches. The first class received their training in 2021.

A virtual All-Workers conference was held in November 2020 gathering together pastors, teachers, Directors of Christian Education, administrators and others to celebrate our common bond in



ministry and to provide encouragement in navigating COVID days.

4) **Resourcing schools for health**
Groundwork has been laid and approved to begin a Lutheran High School of Career Technical Education in Los Angeles County! The target start date is Fall 2022.

This micro-school intends to reach 40 students and become a model to replicate throughout our district and our synod.

With all the challenges COVID has brought, it also brought some blessings to our schools – the great grit of our teachers, new students as parents looked for places where their children would be welcome to learn, and the amazing grace of God connecting people to Jesus of all ages.

As we look to the future and our great God who blesses us with abundantly more, we seek to still resource, support, encourage, strengthen, plant, develop and equip all kinds of congregations to reach all kinds of people.

As the convention meets to either to re-elect or newly elect board members, we look forward to building on our common commitment to our Lord and Savior and the fulfillment of His Great Commission to make disciples of all people.

Thank you for the honor we have had to serve. Thank you for your continued prayers, encouragement, and support of our work together.

As I wrap up 11 years of service and pass the baton on to a new secretary on the board of directors, thank you for the opportunity given to serve our great God and our great ministry opportunity – the people and places of the Pacific Southwest District.

REPORT FROM JON NIEDERBRACH CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

District Operations and Administration

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 4:10-11a

Good stewardship of God's grace and the blessings He has provided to effectively resource Pacific Southwest District (PSD) churches and schools is what your District staff focuses on all day, every day. We truly live and breathe making every effort to increase the number of healthy congregations and schools in our District, so that many more would know Jesus.

The PSD Chief Operating Officer (formerly called the Executive Team Leader) has overall responsibility for aligning PSD functions to best achieve our mission. This includes administrative and business tasks for the smooth, efficient operation of the District, helping congregations and schools address challenges and opportunities, find answers to a wide array of questions, and provide resources that enable greater health. At the highest level, it includes two key areas of focus that flow from our mission described above: 1) executing on vision, and 2) finding ways to do what we do better. Following are some examples of specific outcomes in each of these focus areas.

Execution on vision

- **Retain/Remodel/Replant** – The former St. Paul's-Norwalk, CA congregation closed in 2019, with the property reverting to the District as required by their constitution. Based on our *Retain/Remodel/Replant* strategy, this key location was retained instead of sold, continuing a mission and ministry presence that would otherwise be permanently lost due to high real estate costs. The facility was remodeled into the *PSD Norwalk Mission Development Center* and is currently used in multiple ways, including community outreach and spiritual formation activity, with more opportunities for ministry development planned for the future. As opportunities arise this strategy will be employed in the other areas of the District as well.
- **Rooted-Lutheran Edition** – *Rooted-Lutheran Edition* is an example of the District resourcing congregations, schools and other ministries for greater health. It is a discipleship pathway comprised of a 10-week small group experience that immerses participants in Scripture, Lutheran distinctives of the Christian faith, sacraments, prayer, serving and more. As a licensee of the original Rooted content, we have been blessed in the partnership to adjust the materials to reflect our Lutheran theology and practice. To date, several congregations in PSD and

other districts have already made use of this new and valuable resource. See more at psd-lcms.org/rooted.

- **Lutheran Career & Technical High Schools** – Another strategy that has emerged to provide congregations with resources towards greater health is our initiative to start Lutheran career and technical high schools. Beginning in the greater Los Angeles area, these will be Lutheran “micro-schools” comprised of up to 60 students focused on delivering multiple educational pathways to underserved communities, including trades, technical, and other career options in addition to college preparatory options. School sites will be located on church campuses that have underutilized space, or where school facilities are present but are not being used or rented to other entities. This placement will enable congregations to gain new or additional reach into the community and minister to students and parents.

Process and productivity improvement

- **Digital deployment** – One of the positive effects of the pandemic was to increase greater levels of digital deployment in District systems and processes. We have continued to move from paper-based to electronic processes in our accounting, granting, human resources and other functions for greater efficiency, remote capability and cost-effectiveness.
- **Budget process** – Our annual budgeting process has been revamped and simplified to better

identify, forecast and track operational, board-designated, event/conference, property and other income and expense categories.

- **4DX** – Executive staff trained on and employed a tool based on the book *The 4 Disciplines of Execution* (4DX) to provide greater focus on what we do to achieve our mission. The result is our “Wildly Important Goal”, or the focused activity we should undertake to yield greatest Kingdom impact: leadership development. The coaching initiative that has been implemented is an outcome of that focus.
- **Financial/management reports** – Several improvements have been made to provide better, clearer visibility into District financial data. Given the complex nature of District accounting requirements, simplifying reporting for management and the Board of Directors has enabled better decision-making on multiple levels.

Pandemic Response

We all experienced the massive disruption caused by the pandemic, beginning in March 2020. Like you, the PSD staff quickly mobilized to enable remote work while continuing, and even enhancing, our service to our churches and schools. Our staff performed most admirably under very difficult circumstances, and provided information, insight, tools, prayer and listening ears to help “bear one another’s burdens”. Our web-based COVID resources were viewed over 32,000 times by people all around the synod.

Our online worship directory continues to be one of the top-performing pages on our website.

From online education resources to PPP loan information, personal protective equipment options to church/school worker encouragement and health resources, and significant emergency relief and Soldiers of the Cross funds to online giving and worship resources, your District was blessed to come alongside you and serve you during this historic challenge

Communications

Over the last four years, the reach of the PSD's online communications and presence has drastically increased. Designed and managed by the PSD Director of Communications and Technology Aaron Lucas, our websites have been viewed over 323,000 times over the previous four years. Our email campaigns, including our weekly newsletters, special announcements, and God @ Work stories, have been opened 427,912 times. We will continue improving our online presence by increasing our social media presence and utilizing more online avenues to continue telling the stories of how God is mightily at work in your District and create ways for the people of the PSD to connect and share ideas and encouragement.

Future focus

A few areas we are addressing in the future to better resource churches and schools include:

- **Enhanced communications and development** – God is so powerfully at work in the Pacific Southwest

District, and the stories of His redemptive, transformative work need to be communicated and celebrated. We will enhance our initiatives in curating and sharing these stories and encourage greater levels of support for our shared Great Commission to make disciples of all nations.

- **More administrative resources** – We are continually looking at ways to provide solutions that assist churches and schools to successfully manage all of the accounting, HR, compliance and other administrative functions they are tasked with.
- **Innovative solutions for legacy locations and church worker housing** – When a congregation closes and property is entrusted to the District, our goal is to honor the legacy of the saints who had a missional heart for their community. Along with our Retain/Remodel/Replant strategy we are also exploring innovative ways to assist church workers currently serving in the PSD and as well as considering calls to our District to find affordable housing in an increasingly expensive region. Creative reimagining of property usage can provide ministry and housing solutions that continue God's mission to reach the lost in our communities.

Concordia University Irvine is a private, Lutheran Christian university, founded on the Great Commission of Christ Jesus and rooted in the 500 year Lutheran intellectual tradition, that prepares all students for meaningful lives of service. For nearly 50 years, Concordia has called Orange County home. Offering more than 60 undergraduate and graduate programs designed around our distinctive, award-winning Enduring Questions & Ideas curriculum, students take classes that wrestle with life's toughest questions and prepare them for their professional and personal vocations. Whether students come as residential undergraduates or online graduate students, whether they pursue a Bachelor's, Master's, Ed.D, or (now) Ph.D. they will experience the same mission, vision, and values that animated those founding years and a community of faculty and staff who winsomely share the Gospel in their classes and in turn dedicate themselves to helping students discover their talents and discern their vocations who in turn bring hope to a world that is in desperate need.

WISE, HONORABLE, & CULTIVATED

What we do at CUI matters greatly! We are not just another comprehensive university with professional programs in Southern California. Nor are we just another Christian liberal arts university in the Pacific Southwest. In fact, we offer a unique Christian education among our peers. We are not a university that has drifted from its Christian ethos and only

proclaims a Christian heritage. Nor are we a university that functions as an enclave reserved only for Christian students. We intentionally live in a liminal space—subject, to be sure, to uncomfortable tension—for we are a university that is in the world, but not of the world. And in that in-between space, we prepare wise, honorable, and cultivated citizens who go into the world and live out their God-given vocations!

AN LCMS SCHOOL FOR THE PACIFIC SOUTHWEST DISTRICT (AND BEYOND)

Concordia is a holistic, Lutheran university that forms the whole person: mind, body, heart, and soul. While every university forms the mind, Concordia's faculty and staff—each one a committed practicing Christian—, focus also on the Gospel and the Christian faith, as well as cultivation of Christian virtues and habits in each of our students. We offer a full suite of Church Work programs, from Pre-Seminary and Deaconess studies, to Lutheran Teacher preparation, from Directors of Christian Education to Directors of Parish Music. In partnership with Concordia Seminary St. Louis, we form missionary pastors in the Cross-cultural Ministry Center. We are devoted to expanding these offerings to continue to serve the Pacific Southwest, California Nevada Hawaii, Northwest, Rocky Mountain districts as well as other districts throughout the synod. Additionally, we provide exceptional academic offerings to students who are committed to serving their communities,



churches, and the world through non-sacred vocations. In alignment with

Martin Luther's challenge to the princes of Germany to provide a Christian education in secular vocations, the faculty and staff produce graduates who are in Luther's words "wise, honorable, and cultivated citizens." That word "citizens" can serve as a variable. We help form wise, honorable, and cultivated accountants. Wise, honorable, and cultivated musicians. Biologists. Kinesiologists, Nurses, Teachers, Counselors, Coaches, Actors, Film Makers, Graphic Designers, Historians, Psychologists, etc. who go into the world and live out their God-given vocations in service to others.

WHERE WE ARE & WHERE WE ARE GOING: A FEW HIGHLIGHTS

COVID-19

Despite the difficulties posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, Concordia's faculty and staff demonstrated both their resilience and their complete dedication to students. In March of 2020, Concordia was required by the State of California to vacate campus. The faculty pivoted all their courses to online modalities in just 4 days to ensure that students were not derailed in their course of study. The university vowed to safely reopen campus for students in the next academic year. Putting in place dozens of protocols to mitigate against the spread of the virus, Concordia reopened academic classes, repopulated the residential halls, resumed athletic competitions, provided worship experiences, etc. The Lord blessed these efforts greatly. Concordia's community has emerged stronger from the COVID-19 pandemic.

ACADEMICS

Faculty: We currently have 132 full time faculty members serving in six academic schools. Faculty statistics reveal the dedication to the mission, vision, and values of Concordia: Average years of service: 9.6 years; Total holding terminal degree: 73%; Total of called faculty: 56; Total LCMS faculty 64%.

Academic Leadership: The last four years have brought a new Provost and new Deans. Rev. Dr. Scott Ashmon presides over academics as Provost and Senior Vice President. Terry Olson, Dean of School of Health and Human Sciences; Kent Schlichtemeier (2019-2022) Heather Vezner (2022), Dean of School of Education; Mike Shurance, Dean of Townsend Institute; Bret Taylor, Dean of School of Arts and Sciences; George Wright, School of Business and Economics, Rev. Dr. Steve Mueller (current) Rev. Dr. David Loy (July, 22), Dean of Christ College.

New Academic Programs: The following academic programs have been launched in the last three years:

- Bachelor of Arts: Christian Ministry
- Bachelor of Science: Engineering
- Bachelor of Science: Computer Science
- Bachelor of Arts: Business Administration: Sport Management
- Master of Arts: Educational Leadership
- Master of Arts: Church Leadership

- Master of Science: Public Health
- MBA in Sports Business
- MFT: Counseling
- Ph.D.: Counselor Education and Supervision

Expansion of Accelerated Bachelor of Nursing: In Fall 2021, Concordia received approval to add a partial 3rd cohort of 24 students at our Irvine location. We are pursuing approval to increase that to a full cohort of 72. Additionally, Concordia has expansion plans to offer the ABSN program in satellite sites in Riverside and LA counties in the coming years.

Dual Associate of Arts in Accounting: Concordia, in partnership with Zhejiang Financial College (China), admitted its first cohort in October 2020. Students take two courses taught in English by a CUI adjunct faculty member, along with courses taught by ZFC. Students from ZFC are eligible to transfer to Concordia and complete their BA in Accounting as a matriculating undergraduate.

Servant Leadership Institute: A gift of \$1.5 million dollars from the Kern Family Foundation enabled Concordia to create the Servant Leadership Institute (SLI). The SLI will expand our ability to impact the lives of not only our students, but schools across the nation as we equip students, teachers, counselors, and administrators with servant leadership strategies and strong character. Dr. Kent Schlichtemeier is serving as the inaugural Director.

Around the USA Semester/Around-the-World™ semester: We recently approved a new American Humanities minor, which involves a semester-long trip during which students will visit all of

the lower 48 states while earning a semester's worth of credit. This program is similar to our successful Around-the-World™ semester, which has been offered six times since 2010. ATW includes visits to countries as varied as Jordan, Thailand, Bali, Mongolia, South Africa, Kenya, Brazil, Peru, etc. The chief difference between ATUSA and ATW is that students in this new domestic program will travel by van rather than by air, train, and bus, and they will camp most nights, as they visit scenic and historic sites throughout the country.

STUDENT EXPERIENCE

Concordia's Beautiful and Safe Campus: Concordia is blessed to be located on a beautiful, gated campus perched on top of a hill in Irvine, one of America's safest cities. Our 72-acre campus is located just 10 minutes from the beach and 20 minutes from Disneyland and is surrounded by growing industries, such as IT, finance, medical and health care, engineering, and EV companies. Internships are plentiful, and our students have the opportunity to grow both on and off campus.

Student Spirit Initiative: The Hunt for the Golden Eagle: This initiative has been a great success in encouraging students to rebuild school spirit as we emerge from the pandemic shutdowns over the last two years. Students are attending athletic contests in greater numbers and compete as residential cohorts to win the Golden Eagle trophy in May. Through a student vote, they renamed the student section of the CU Arena as "Flight Club," a nod to the Eagles mascot.

Student Engagement and Gathering spaces: Six student lounges and other amenities have been built or renovated during the last 18 months and are being well used. Students are also participating in other events, gatherings, intramurals, and enjoying the new 18 hole Frisbee golf course that weaves through campus. Concordia's outdoor recreation program, including outbound hiking, camping, and biking trips, is enabling students to get beyond campus and explore the southwestern United States.

MINISTRY

Chief Mission Officer: Vice President, Rev. Dr. Steven Mueller serves in this role to ensure that Concordia remains steadfast in our commitment to offering a faithful, rigorous academic experience rooted in the Lutheran intellectual tradition. Concordia will continue to hire faculty and staff who are committed, practicing Christians. Dr. Mueller continues to oversee Concordia's Vision, Mission, and Vocation program that provides a deep orientation and iterative training program to ensure mission alignment for all faculty and staff. He also works with other ministry, identity, and church relations projects.

Campus Ministry: Each week Concordia offers many ministry opportunities. Mid-morning chapel is offered four days a week (M, T, TH, F), with an average of 250 worshippers. There are two additional evening services: Sunday Source (a communion service), and Shout, a mid-week devotional service. Supplementing these worship services, Concordia currently offers 16 small-group Bible studies and various mission opportunities.

ConcordiaServes. In 2020, we began a campus-wide day of service, ConcordiaServes. More than 1,100 athletes, coaches, students, faculty, and staff participated, working on 17 different projects across Orange County from the city of Orange, to the beach, throughout Irvine and on campus. In 2021, despite pandemic restrictions, we had more participants. This annual event makes a significant impact in our community and allows us the opportunity to be present among our neighbors as we serve alongside others.

Special Events: A Concordia Christmas: In 2020, PBS SoCal approached Concordia to provide new musical programming during the pandemic. In just 6 weeks, Concordia's music department, in conjunction with Ministry and Advancement teams, created "All is Bright: A Concordia Christmas." This special was well-received, aired throughout southern California, and won two Telly Awards. PBS partnered with Concordia once again in 2021. "Repeat the Sounding Joy: A Concordia Christmas" aired 8 times locally and was also available online. Local PBS aired 150 commercials for the show and promoted this with their top viewed social media post of the season. The *Los Angeles Times* listed this as a "Must Watch" Show. PBS also requested a 30 minute, edited version of the previous "All is Bright: A Concordia Christmas" special for national distribution. That program was broadcast nationally more than 500 times on 75% of the PBS stations throughout the U.S., including 19 of the top 25 markets. The program for next year, tentatively titled "A

Thrill of Hope,” is already being developed. Thanks be to God for this opportunity to share the Gospel through music and spoken word throughout the nation during the season of Christmas.

District Conferences: Concordia has sent representatives, including Rev. Dr. Steve Mueller, Rev. Bil Hood, Dr. Michael Thomas, et al., to church worker conferences in the Pacific Southwest, California Nevada Hawaii, Pacific Northwest, and Rocky Mountain districts. This was the first time we’ve made significant visits like these in the Northwest District. Our presence is important, as we want church and school leaders to see our campus as their Concordia. We have been warmly received and encouraged to participate annually.

Best Practices for Ministry Conference: In 2022, Dr. Thomas, Rev. Dr. Steve Mueller, Rev. Bil Hood, Megan Bouslaugh, Monique Nunes, and Prof. Michelle Thompson opened the conference with a panel discussion on leadership. This is the largest Lutheran conference in the region, and we were honored to present on the resiliency of the Concordia community during these last two years. We are even more honored to continue to serve as a resource and partner in ministry with Best Practice Ministry, PSD, and local congregations and schools.

LEST: We are planning for the **Lutheran Elementary School Tournament** to be held in February, 2023. Concordia anticipates hosting between 1000-1500 middle school students who will participate in athletic, academic, and arts competitions/events. Thanks to Crean Lutheran High School and Orange Lutheran High School (OLu) for their

partnership. This is an amazing opportunity to showcase Concordia, Crean, and OLu to Lutheran elementary school students, staff, faculty, and families from the entire western U.S.

COMMUNITY & EXTERNAL RELATIONS

Center for Civics Education: The Center’s mission is to train and develop citizens and leaders to effectively engage in public policy decision-making through seminars, workshops, dialogues, debates, internship programs and collaboration with business, civic, philanthropic, government, political, ethnic and religious organizations and institutions. The Center is non-partisan and welcomes discussions and debates based on the principles underlying “marketplace of ideas,” including civility, mutual respect and informed participation.

FINANCIALS

Forward in Faith: Our 7 ½ year comprehensive campaign was the largest and most ambitious in the university’s history. Our \$85 million goal was bold, and the results were no less awe inspiring. Launched in 2013, the Forward in Faith campaign, under the leadership of President Kurt Krueger, focused on new facilities, scholarships, academic programs, and the university’s endowment. We knew donors would step out in faith with us and the response is quite humbling. Over 10,000 donors—made up of alumni, parents, churches, and community members—shared God’s blessings with the Concordia students of today and for generations to come. The initial goal was surpassed with a final total of \$100M.

Borland-Manske Center Grand Opening: On Saturday, October 5, 2019, Parents' Weekend featured the opening of the Borland-Manske Center, which includes two wings dedicated to Theology and Music. More than 800 people were in attendance for this grand opening, and the Borland-Manske Center has proved to be a pivotal location on campus for academic and co-curricular learning.

Concordia's Endowment: Forward in Faith contributions helped increase the endowment to more than \$50 million dollars. Endowment growth is central to the financial health of universities because the annual distributions fund student scholarship perpetually. During the summer of 2021, Goldman-Sachs, the premier financial firm in the nation began managing the endowment on our behalf.

Vision 2025 – Phase II+ of the Master Plan for Concordia's Campus: As Forward in Faith closed, an anonymous donor pledged \$25M for the completion of Phase II+ (estimated at \$32M). University Advancement is working diligently to raise the remaining funds necessary to complete this project. Phase II+ includes six distinctive projects that will completely transform the heart of the Concordia campus: These include four renovations and two new buildings:

- CU Center for Worship and the Performing Arts (Renovation and Expansion from 500 to 800 seats for worship, music performances, and theatre productions)
- Nelson Amphitheater (Renovation to 350 seats with a permanent stage for theatre, worship, and music)

- Softball Field (Renovation includes permanent spectator seating, press box, etc.)
- CU Arena (Renovation includes HVAC upgrades)
- Eagle Athletic Complex (both a Field House to hold seven athletic teams and a Fitness Center). Both buildings will enhance our offerings for NCAA Division II athletes and other students.

Concordia Library: The library will undergo an extensive renovation, funded by a very generous \$1.5M gift from Paul and Cathy Schroeder, supporters of Concordia for nearly 40 years. Thanks be to God for their continued dedication and devotion to Concordia. This renovation will include the renovation of the library to the 1st floor with compact shelving and new study spaces for individual study and group work. The upper level will become the central hub for all student success services, including Academic Advising, Writing Center, Tutoring, Disability Access Services, etc.

Henley Director of Pre-Seminary Studies and Christ College Scholars: Concordia recently received a \$1M gift from Mr. Doy Henley to establish a named Directorship of pre-seminary studies and to fund additional scholarships for church work students.

5 YEARS AND BEYOND

Brand Study & Identity Initiative: Concordia University Irvine is conducting an intensive examination of our brand, identity, and marketing initiatives. Intentionally, we aim to emphasize our core values, our brand proposition, and refine the way we

speak to various audiences (prospective students, families, alumni congregations, donors, etc.) so that our message is authentic, true, and relevant. We are working with Kanahoma, a marketing and research firm located in San Diego. Starting with extensive research and focus groups, both external and internal to Concordia, the findings were very encouraging. While Concordia has low brand awareness outside of Orange County, those who know us, namely students, parents, alumni, and the LCMS, have a very high affinity for Concordia. In summary, those who know us are raving fans who confirm that we deliver on our promises. But few know us, and we aim to change that by rolling out a consistent brand strategy. Look for new visual identity offerings and a refreshed marketing campaign in the months to come.

30/60/300: CUI continues to build relationships throughout southern California as part of the 30/60/300 initiative. The goal is to cultivate meaningful relationships with 30 top civic/60 top ministry/300 top business leaders in Orange County to prioritize ways that CUI can be perceived and valued as an integral, respected partner in the City of Irvine and the surrounding communities, and the premier faith-based university in Orange County. Already members of the President's Cabinet are engaging representatives off campus and are serving on non-profit boards throughout Orange County.

Concordia's faculty, staff, and students have so very much to be thankful for. We want to offer our appreciation for our on-going partnership with the congregations of the Pacific Southwest District. Our

connection with each of you and our shared ministry in proclaiming the gospel to those in desperate need of hope is a true gift from the Lord. Thank you for your continued prayers, partnerships, and your support in every way. Additionally, we are very excited to continue to serve the entire western U.S., including the California Nevada Hawaii, Rocky Mountain, and Northwest districts of the LCMS.

Concordia wants to offer special thanks to President Kurt Krueger. His leadership for more than a decade and his commitment to hiring faculty and staff who profess and practice their faith has made all the difference in setting us on a path for the future. Our Lutheran-Christian identity is a central, differentiating aspect of what we offer to students and their families

The Regents, Trustees, donors, and friends of Concordia are a special treasure that God has provided. Each of these people give generously of their time, talent, and treasure to ensure a private Christian education for the next generation of students. In turn, Concordia's alumni go into their communities, churches, and world and serve through all of their vocations.

REPORT FROM REV. GLENN FLUEGGE CROSS-CULTURAL MINISTRY

Cross-cultural Ministry Center (CMC) **Forming missionary pastors to** **cross cultures and reach the lost with** **the Gospel**

The Cross-cultural Ministry Center (CMC) is a graduate-level seminary program at Concordia University Irvine (CUI). We partner with Concordia Seminary, St. Louis (CSL) to form Lutheran "missionary pastors." A little about the program:

Year the program began in partnership with CSL: 1995

Number of graduates serving as pastors across the nation: 75

Number of students currently enrolled: 25

Number of years it takes most students to complete the program: 4

Semester hours of theology courses taken: 77 (similar to M.Div.)

Semester hours of Greek taken: 6

Semester hours of a modern language taken: 6 (unless bilingual already)

Length of vicarage: 4+ years concurrent with coursework

Percentage of courses taught via live video conferencing: around 70%

Percentage of courses taught face-to-face: around 30%

Degree conferred: M.A. in Theology (M.Div. equivalent)

Degree accreditation: WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges)

LCMS roster status upon completion: General Pastor Certification

Percentage of tuition covered by in-house scholarships: up to 66%

Program training focus: Missionary pastors crossing cultures and reaching the lost in their surrounding communities

Current CMC students reside in six different states, and in Hong Kong, and represent seven different LCMS districts.

CMC students come from a wide variety of cultural and ethnic backgrounds. More than 60% of the current CMC student body is non-White and all of the students' new ministry launches intentionally reach across cultural boundaries.

The CMC curriculum includes four years of graduate level theological studies, and four years of concurrent vicarage work. Those men who finish the CMC receive general pastor certification for ordination in the LCMS from Concordia Seminary and a M.A. in Theology from CUI.

While engaging in their coursework, CMC students are also embedded in a unique missional vicarage in an LCMS congregation. During this concurrent vicarage, online technologies are employed to hold vicars accountable to a

regiment of activities which intentionally develop their ministry and missionary skills. They learn the important work of a Lutheran pastor serving within the congregation, while also learning the missionary skills of crossing cultures and reaching the lost in their surrounding community. In fact, all vicars are required to plan, launch, and develop a new culture-crossing ministry before they graduate.

Of course, the costs of completing four years of study and vicarage can be a prohibitive for many potential students. In order to address this challenge, CUI established “The All Nations Endowment for the CMC” which funds scholarships for qualified students. By God’s grace, the endowment has grown over the past few years to the point of funding annual scholarships for about half of the CMC students. O give thanks unto the Lord!

In 2020, the CMC celebrated a quarter of century of training Lutheran missionary pastors at Concordia University Irvine in collaboration with Concordia Seminary. In the coming years, with God’s help and with your prayers, the CMC will restructure and bolster its course offerings, strengthen its partnership with

Concordia Seminary, expand its communications with the broader LCMS church body, and grow the endowment in order to scholarship more students. As we look forward to the next twenty-five years, the CMC will continue to carry out its mission to form faithful missionary pastors to cross cultures and reach the lost with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

REPORT FROM REV. DR. RICHARD PAUL INTENTIONAL INTERIM MINISTRY

Intentional Interim Ministry continues to be a ministry of the Pacific Southwest District and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod that seeks to aid congregations at a time of transition. These periods can be filled with a lot of joy and anticipation, or they can remain times of anxiety, struggle and concern.

Intentional Interim Ministry seeks to provide congregations with pastors, trained to assist congregations with the tasks that confront them in a time of transition. The Interim Pastors of our district are all trained to carry out this specialized ministry.

Quoting from the WEB site of the Interim Ministry Conference of the LC-MS we read: "Intentional Interim Ministry is designed to restore congregational health by offering a safe bridge between challenging times and the selection of the next permanent pastor." These challenging times can range from the grief of losing a pastor who has faithfully served the congregation for a long time, to congregations in the midst of conflict, to congregations recovering from pastoral misconduct. Whatever the circumstances, these times are often filled with stress, making it difficult to carry out effective ministry.

The last four years have been particularly challenging for Interim Ministry. The COVID pandemic has made it difficult for

congregations to even consider interim ministry due to the challenges of the restrictions that have been imposed on all of us. Congregations have had difficulty meeting and securing Interim pastors to move around during this time has been very challenging.

We are currently facing a major area of concern. We are attempting to recruit and train more men in the practice of Intentional Interim Ministry. The strength of the program depends on quality individuals, trained in the understanding the process of transition, and dedicated to this unique and special ministry of our church. At the moment we have more congregations seeking the services of a trained Interim Pastor than we have qualified pastors to serve in this ministry.

In the past four years we have been successful in encouraging more congregations who find themselves in a time of transition to seriously consider Intentional Interim Ministry as their first choice of ministry. We truly believe that a well-trained, experienced and dedicated interim pastor can be a wonderful blessing to a congregation and an important part of laying the foundation for the next permanent pastor. However, the current demand for trained pastors exceeds our ability to provide qualified candidates for congregations to consider. We are working to solve this problem.



As you are aware there are a growing number of congregations in decline, unable to afford a full-time pastor. Yet they want to be in ministry, and they want to seek God's direction for their congregation. This has challenged us to think in different terms how to not only provide Interims for this growing concern, but how best to use these men and their training to aid congregations struggling to do meaningful ministry in their setting.

We need to remember that we are in ministry "together." How can we support and strengthen each other in our respective ministries? We want to be ready to help congregations in all kinds of transition situations to find a God pleasing and dynamic way to address their ministry concerns.

We are also blessed in the PSW District to have an excellent resource in the person of Rev. Peter Alexander. Peter has led the efforts to revise the training program for Intentional Interim Ministry for the church at large. He serves on the board of the Interim Ministry Conference of the LC-MS and is currently the Dean of the faculty teaching the Basic Education Course for Interim Ministry. Peter is an excellent resource and would enjoy talking about Interim Ministry.

INTER-LUTHERAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE (I-LERT)

I-LERT is a network based within the Lutheran community of Southern California. It is made collaborative effort of the Pacific Southwest District – LCMS, the Pacifica Synod – ELCA, the Southwest California Synod - ELCA, and Lutheran Social Services. I-LERT currently serves Southern California.

I-LERT serves as a central hub from which information and training on disaster preparedness is circulated, and through which resources can be directed to individuals, families, and churches during an emergency.

Since the onset of COVID, the I-LERT team has not been meeting. The primary responsibility for I-LERT has shifted from the Pacific Southwest District to Lutheran Social Services. REPORT FROM DR. VICTORIA WAUFLE LAY MINISTRY DIRECTOR

Last four years' activities...Annually averaged 2 - 3 day long Regional Workshops (11 total, one was not held due to COVID-19), 3 annual Continuing Education seminars, 26 former Deacons Ordained as Pastors the most recent December 12, 2022, 5 new Deacons and 1 Parish Ministry Assistant were Commissioned in their home church with 3 Deacon Candidates preparing for their Final Interview in the next few months. Finally, they will be Commissioned to serve in their church by a Regional Vice President.

Goals for the next triennium...Continue organization of Regional Workshops as well as Continuing Education seminars, further assist in developing a standardized Lay Ministry program within the 3 Salt-Water Districts, work more closely with Mission Training Center at Concordia University Irvine as additional laity courses are developed, expand the Lay Ministry program to include more people in various avenues of service within the Pacific Southwest District.

Successes...2020 & 2021 presented numerous challenges for the church. Probably one of the more difficult issues faced was not being able to provide comfort and Spiritual Care for families when they needed it most. An unforeseen upside of COVID-19 is it forced us to learn how to deliver Ministry in a multitude of ways. The PMAs & Deacons delivered individual Bible Studies via Google Meets, had ZOOM visits with parishioners, mailed out

individual cards w/scripture to congregants, and learned to use a variety of other platforms. Others were able to serve their church in the technology arena by setting up an online format for parishioners to be able to observe worship service. When a Pastor became ill everyone became aware of what a blessing it was that a trained Deacon was onsite to help alleviate the strain of Pastor's absence. In spite of everything God's Word went forth...yes, the Lay Ministry program still exists!

We've grown from a mere \$100 million when LCEF was first incorporated to over 60,000 faithful Lutheran investors with over \$2.1 billion dollars in total assets.

LCEF is financially strong because of you, the individuals and institutions that invest with us. Your investments make it possible for LCEF to develop, sustain and grow relationships with LCMS Ministries. This means we can provide the resources congregations, schools, Recognized Service Organizations and Rostered Church Workers need to continue to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ.

COVID Remedies – When the pandemic hit, LCEF did not wait for borrowers to contact us. We reached out to listen to concerns about challenges they were facing due to the necessary, but tight restrictions on gatherings, social distancing, and shelter-in-place orders.

In response to what was shared, numerous resources were developed by LCEF to address specific needs. And because the needs were unique, so were the solutions. These solutions for borrowers included full payment deferrals, interest-only payments and emergency loans or lines of credit. In all, LCEF provided solutions to 245 ministries with a total loan balance of nearly \$250 million. In the PSD, 32 congregations took advantage of at least one of these remedies to help them get through the uncertain times. We are pleased to share that nearly every congregation is back to full payments.

Investments – Investing with LCEF means earning a great rate and equipping LCMS pastors, churches, schools, and organizations to fulfill their call of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Through their investments, 2,602 PSD investors help fund the mission of LCEF. These PSD investors make up 4.7% of the total LCEF investors.

Lending Solutions – We understand LCMS ministries like no other lender can and structure loans to fit you and your ministry perfectly. We are privileged to have 107 loan partner congregations in the PSD. This makes up 8.0% of the total LCEF congregation loans. LCEF also

partners with RSOs and Rostered Church Workers.

Real Estate Solutions – Whether working with an individual church, organization or district, this team becomes an extension of that ministry to help them best steward their entrusted assets.

Ministry Solutions – Discover how to joyfully live out your purpose, clarify your vision or expand your ministry. Over the past 4 years, 17 PSD congregations have engaged with Ministry Solutions to help clarify God's purpose for their congregation and conduct capital campaigns to fund projects.

Looking Forward

We continue to strive to be a Ministry Partner to the congregations, schools, Recognized Service Organizations and Roster Church Workers in the Pacific Southwest District as they work to transform lives and make the Great Commission real.

The primary focus of our District staff is to empower the ministries and rostered church workers we serve within the Pacific Southwest District. Assistance is possible by the offering and programs developed by LCEF. Another priority is growing our investor portfolio which will, in turn, provide more funds for the ministries within our District. We encourage you to explore the investment opportunities offered by LCEF.



REPORT FROM REV. DOMINIC RIVKIN MISSION AND MINISTRY

Then (Jesus) opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.

The Church is a people gathered, equipped, and sent by God to be witness of the Living Word, Jesus Christ. The Church is *God's plan* to fulfill *God's Mission*; to reach people and communities in desperate need of life and hope in Jesus Christ. We believe that it takes all kinds of ministries to reach all kinds of people. The Pacific Southwest District is dedicated to effective resourcing of congregations and schools for transforming lives and making the Great Commission real.

Mission and Ministry Services provides the consulting and coaching to empower leaders, launch new missions, and encourage effective ministries that respond to the great commission Jesus gave to his Church. The newest iteration of our team began in October 2019 with the addition of Rev. Dominic Rivkin as Mission Executive. Since then, we have worked together with the District Staff to develop, inspire, motivate, and strengthen leaders to lead churches and schools to greater health and capacity in spreading the Good News of Jesus.

Your district believes that healthy leaders engage and empower new leaders and that healthy ministries envision and start new ministries. In 2021 we created the **PSD C.A.R.E.S.** initiative which guides our work:

Coaching is a purposeful relationship to identify, draw out and celebrate all God is doing through a ministry leader. We've trained and deployed 20 ministry coaches to engage school and church leaders to work through ministry opportunities God presents.

Assessing the "why, what, and how" of mission and ministry is vital for reaching the communities we serve. We're connected to a set of personal and group assessment tools through trusted partners to clarify your path to Gospel-centered community impact.

Resourcing a mission or ministry by curating the highest quality, scripturally grounded content is a priority for our team. During the pandemic we created videos, blog posts, and reviews helpful to congregations and schools as they negotiated the "new normal".

Equipping ministry leaders with relevant and engaging webinars and events such as *Small Church Essentials* and *MissionWest* provided a low-cost, high-impact way offering ongoing training to leaders of the district and across the country.

Supporting new mission and ministry endeavors remains a hallmark of district services. A simplified granting and



reporting structure was implemented through our Regional Mission Councils that helps with innovation, incubation, and impact funding.

We believe that the roots of fruitful mission and ministry are strong Biblical theology, deep Spiritual foundation, and wide reach of mission and ministry competencies to meet our rapidly changing world. Some of the newest tools we are developing are in the areas of partnership, discipleship, and new ministry starts.

Better Together:

Ministry partnerships of various types are becoming the norm in the post-pandemic church. We're assisting local congregations and circuits to find innovative ways to connect and even combine for the sake of extending the mission of God into new communities. New groups have already developed as mission societies, focused on local ministry development, in San Diego and Las Vegas. Affinity Groups, already common in our ethnic specific churches, will soon be extended into ministries beyond their local geography.

ReNew:

A new discipleship, leadership, and mission tool that exists to equip everyone to live out the tangible love of God in their local neighborhoods. This initiative is being launched from the district's new Mission Development Center in Norwalk, CA. The team will soon be ready to come alongside congregations as you connect to communities throughout the PSD.

New Start Network:

As a tool to help meet the goal of launching 100 new faith communities by 2031, we're excited to begin our launch of the PSD New Start Network. This

group is laser focused on equipping and resourcing new Gospel proclaiming ministries that include, but are not limited to, conventional churches and schools.

Campus Mission Coalition:

We continue to invest in the next generation of Christian leaders on college campuses throughout the district. The Campus Mission Coalition builds bridges with students, connecting them with local congregations. Current ministries exist at USCD, San Diego State, UCLA, Cal State Northridge, Pierce College, and ASU.

Local Mission Societies:

In partnership with Holy Cross Lutheran Church and local congregations we are working to develop a mission society to launch and support new faith communities in the city of San Diego. In addition, the Tri-State Mission Society is working alongside local Las Vega area congregations to begin Hispanic leadership development and ministry from Redeemer Lutheran in East Las Vegas.

We give thanks to God for the opportunity to be sent to serve the mission and ministry of the Pacific Southwest District. We extend our gratitude to our current team and to all those who went before, dedicating themselves to build a firm foundation for our work. May we remain as faithful to God, to you, and to those who will receive the gift of salvation in Christ Jesus through your work!



REPORT FROM REV. MARK SIEGERT MISSION TRAINING CENTER COORDINATOR

Mission Training Center (MTC) has been serving the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod for more than thirty years. Like everything and everyone else, COVID impacted our work, but it did not interrupt our ability to provide online training courses for God's people across the country and around the world. The closure of Concordia University Portland also had a significant impact on MTC, but the Lord has given us the opportunity to move forward and grow into a new chapter of our history. We are now supported by all three of the West Coast Districts of the LCMS (Northwest, California-Nevada-Hawaii, and Pacific Southwest). And those three districts have moved MTC into a collaborative partnership with Concordia University Irvine.

As we moved into our new setting, we were able to revisit our mission, values, and objectives. Whether our students are looking for licensure or not, we exist to **Equip God's people to actively and confidently engage in God's mission.**

In the last four years, 2018-2021, Mission Training Center has processed 615 registrations across 71 courses. A total of 195 unique students have been served. Of those, 63 came to MTC as part of a formal deacon training program and another 45 took one or more classes for personal development or to meet the requirements of their employer or other educational program.

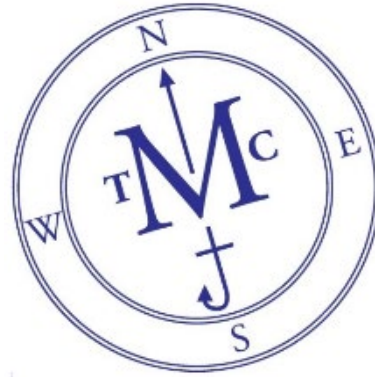
We are currently working on a project that will expand the way we deliver course content. Yet, regardless of presentation style, our training experiences will remain anchored in God's Word and mission-oriented; they will transform the lives and hearts of our students. With that in mind, we design and develop all our MTC training experiences so that our students will

1. ground their lives in the truth of God's Word.
2. translate their knowledge and skills into mission action.
3. serve as unifying mission leaders in their communities.
4. pursue ongoing learning for service in mission and ministry.

Throughout our history, we have made our programming accessible and that will not change.

- We will continue to use online technologies to deliver synchronous and asynchronous experiences to God's people "on the ground" who are involved in God's mission.
- Moving forward, we would like to develop a platform that will allow our students to stay connected with each other. It is important to develop a sense of community among our MTC students—regardless of where they are located or why they are engaging in MTC experiences

- *Although there is a financial cost to produce and deliver our training experiences, we strive to keep the cost structure at an accessible level. For those students who need assistance, many districts, congregations, and organizations willingly provide financial support.*
- *Additionally, we are employing strategies which will make our training experiences more accessible to leaders in non-English speaking communities. We have been able to offer a few MTC experiences entirely in languages other than English, and we are developing courses geared for the unique challenges faced by leaders in non-Anglo cultures.*

REPORT FROM RACHEL KLITZING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SCHOOL MINISTRY

The Pacific Southwest District **mission** is to effectively resource congregations and schools for transforming lives and making the Great Commission REAL. The **purpose** of School Ministries is to be connected in Christ and connected with each other by building and maintaining God-focused relationships.

During this past triennium we have intentionally and purposefully worked to integrate these goals into strategies and action plans which drive our ministry and priorities each day.

My sincere thanks to each of you who are reading this report for investing your time and interest in the district and in ways in which we can better serve the Lord with the gifts He has given us in this great region of the U.S.! Since the pandemic hit in 2020, overall, our schools have seen increased enrollment but more importantly, increased dependency on the Sovereignty of the God we serve and increased awareness and urgency for getting the precious Gospel message proclaimed through our Lutheran schools and congregations! Please read on!

School Ministries Updates and Highlights

School Ministries in the Pacific Southwest District serves 105 Early Childhood Centers, 50 Elementary Schools, and 8 High Schools. Almost 20,000 children are served by almost 2,000 educators. This past school year, as a result of the mission and ministry of Pacific Southwest District Lutheran schools, 356 children were baptized, and 293 adults were confirmed. Enrollment by ethnicity – 59% White; 11.5% Hispanic; 11% Multi-race; 9.57% Asian; 4.2% Other; 3.33% Black; .9% Pacific Islander; and .5% American Indian.

District services to schools and congregations have been guided and provided by the staff of School Ministries as well as a number of task forces, committees, networks and cabinets. Cabinets, task forces, and committees are made up of over 100 volunteer professional educators representing each of the six school regions. The following information highlights professional growth and training, communication pieces, and resources developed and provided by the School Ministries staff and many of our educators who serve in a variety of capacities.

The **Lutheran Educators Conference** provides the single-most comprehensive and extensive continuing education opportunity for school personnel at all levels. Attendance at the annual conference has been between 900 – 1,000 participants. The conference features nationally-recognized presenters, both from within the LCMS system and from other educational entities. Officers are elected by the conference. LEC focuses on three primary areas: Spiritual Nurture/Faith Walk, Sustained Professional Learning, and Homecoming (Fellowship). A Spiritual theme is integrated throughout the conference as well as in the weeks leading up to the event and the weeks following the event with a series of devotions and Bible studies written by educators of the district. Our professional learning time is tracked into areas of singular focus with extended time spent with the expert in that area of learning, and our fellowship time will include several local and national service projects. In 2014 we created a partnership with the CNH District to come

together for our conference. This was well received by educators and administrators in the CNH District, and we continue to partner with the CNH District to bring LEC to educators (DCE's, teachers and administrators) in both districts. LEC will be held November 20-22, 2022, at the Hilton Bayfront Hotel in San Diego.

The **Accreditation Commission** oversees NLSA/WASC/Cognia accreditation in district schools. Our **Early Childhood Accreditation Commission** provides oversight to all preschools as they go through the accreditation process. In the Pacific Southwest District, we have 38 K-12 accredited schools and 29 accredited early childhood centers. Accreditation is a top priority in the district! This year we had 20 schools go through the accreditation process!

Seven regions comprise the schools of the Pacific Southwest District. The regions sponsor annual teacher in-services, track meets, and spelling bees, as well as STEM events for students. The six regions have active monthly administrators' meetings (early childhood directors and elementary/high school principals).

The **Consultancy Project** was developed with strategic leaders in the Pacific Southwest District in 2016. Consultancy is a strategic initiative to strengthen and sustain our district schools. The primary purpose of the Consultancy is for a school and its leaders to receive wise and trusted counsel on a key strategic question, providing new perspectives on challenges, along with action steps to

implement. To date, 13 schools have gone through the Consultancy process.

The **Western Alliance of High School Administrators**, Lutheran High School administrators from the western portion of the United States, meet for annual leaders' retreats and conferences planned in partnership with Concordia University, Irvine.

The **District Principals' Council** sponsors a three-day conference in July and provides support and consultation to new administrators.

Strengthening Partnerships

- **Concordia University, Irvine** – Joint initiatives and support from CUI and its leadership include Professional Development opportunities, the Call, Colloquy, and Placement process, etc. Concordia Irvine generously sponsors our Lutheran Educators Conference, and annually has an alumni reception at LEC! We have hundreds of CUI Alumna who are part of our congregation and school ministry in the district!
- **Lutheran Special Education Ministries** – Includes partnership with Lutheran Special Education Ministries (LSEM), we have a network of support called Lutheran Association of Resource Specialists (LARS). This network meets twice annually to support each other and share relevant information in the field of special education and teaching children with special learning needs. They also make themselves available to support, encourage, and provide resources for other PSD schools that do not have a resource teacher on their campus.

- Lutheran Education Association (LEA)** – This year, a joint conference of LEA, ALSS (Association of Lutheran Secondary Schools), and LCMS School Ministries was held in Orlando, FL, March 27-29. Two dozen of our educators represented the PSD at this event. For the first time in 2022, two of our PSD educators have received special national LEA awards: **Maeson Lovie**, Christ Greenfield, Gilbert, AZ, received the Outstanding New Elementary Teacher Award, and **Mark Klitzing**, Orange Lutheran High School, Orange, CA, received the Distinguished Lutheran Secondary Educator Award.

Grantparent Tuition Assistance Mission Project

The **Grantparent program**, a School Ministries mission project for the Pacific Southwest District of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, provides tuition assistance enabling children to receive an excellent Christian and academic education in urban communities. Through the Grantparent project, children are sponsored for \$600 a year (elementary) or \$1200 a year (high school). Children are selected by the school on the basis of need from families who have requested financial aid. This enables these children to attend a Lutheran school in our most urban schools. This past school year 59 students in eight district urban schools (Prince of Peace Lutheran, Anaheim; Zion Lutheran, Anaheim; Emmaus Lutheran, Alhambra; Victory Lutheran School, Chula Vista; Pacific Lutheran

Jr/Sr HS, Gardena; St. John's Lutheran, Hemet; Redeemer Lutheran, Las Vegas;

Christ the Cornerstone Lutheran School, San Diego) receive tuition assistance through the Grantparent program. In the nineteen years since Grantparent tuition assistance began, 917 students have been sponsored with tuition assistance. We plan to also provide Grantparent scholarships to students at the new LuTEC high school in 2022-23. Plans are in the works for a special 20th anniversary celebration of Grantparent in Fall 2022. **God is at work all the time!**

Hearts for Jesus

The 2021-2022 Hearts for Jesus PSD unified mission project was World Mission. World Mission provides the "Treasure" to unreached people groups around the world. The "Treasure" is an MP3 player that is a solar powered Bible available in over 4,000 languages and dialects. Our goal was that every PSD school contribute \$250 which is enough for five Treasures. If each of our schools contributed at least that amount, we could help World Mission share 700 Treasures! That is, in essence, 700 Bibles going out into the world to share the Gospel message of salvation with unreached people groups around the world! Because it is estimated that each Treasure is heard by 144 people per year, our PSD schools could potentially share the Gospel in this way to 100,800 people or more! As of publishing time for this report \$20,769.20 has been contributed towards 415 Treasures!.

Career & Technical Education High School in Los Angeles County - LuTEC

As you are aware, we are embarking on an exciting new mission opportunity to provide a vehicle through which, we fervently pray, we can re-engage congregations and communities by sharing the love of Christ through Lutheran education via a Career and Technical Education High School. Our new Director, **Todd Moritz**, started March 1, and was installed on April 9. Todd has been on a fast pace since he began his work with us! He meets with me on a weekly basis to share updates on the project. It is clear to me that the Lord led the right person to this position in Todd. He is truly a visionary leader with a “can do” spirit. His business savvy and entrepreneurial strategies have already landed some great connections within the area! He has already met with three elementary school principals in the area to set up focus group meetings with parents of 8th graders. We have contracted with Soaring Education Services (Dr. Jack Preus), a division of Open Sky Education, for “back-office support”. We are looking to Orange Lutheran Online (OLO) for our online courses.

Todd has also already engaged LuTEC’s Founding Steering Committee with 13 members, and has conducted two meetings, the first March 28, the second April 18. Steering Committee members are well qualified and eager to serve!

Our plan is to utilize the existing preschool at the PSD Mission Development Center in Norwalk, do needed renovations, and be able to open

in the Fall or soon thereafter. If you have any questions or wish to get more involved in this project, please let me know! Please PRAY for this endeavor! We need your prayers!

STUDENT AID 2022 CONVENTION REPORT

In the past, the Pacific Southwest District has provided financial aid to students who have attended one of our universities or seminaries and had been preparing for full-time church work. Although the amounts were small, compared to the cost of their education, the students have appreciated the fact that their district cared enough to provide encouragement to those who were planning for a future in church work.

Over the past four years, the District has made changes in the Student Aid Program. These are the changes and the

PSD BACHELOR-DEGREE CHURCH WORKER LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

PSD Bachelor-Degree Church Worker Scholarships are now granted AFTER COMPLETION of an approved Bachelor-Degree Church Work Program.

Rationale: Over the last decade the amount of available scholarship funds has significantly declined. We also know that it is common for university students to change majors one or more times over the course of their college career. It is our hope that, by restricting PSD Bachelor-Degree Scholarship Grants to students who have graduated as Church Work Students, we will have the ability to grant a higher dollar amount per student to assist them in student loan retirement. Currently, if a PSD Scholarship is given to the student while they are attending university, that dollar amount is usually subtracted from the total of scholarships received to reduce

tuition. Recipients may request to have their PSD Bachelor-Degree Scholarship Grant applied directly to their student loan.

Frequency: These are annual grants. A recipient is limited to a total of four grants.

As we transition to the new scholarship method: PSD Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor-Degree Church Work program who have already received one or more years of PSD Scholarship assistance may, upon graduation, apply for this scholarship. Example: If you have previously received one year of a PSD scholarship, you may, upon graduation, apply for the next three years to receive a total of four scholarships. If you've already received three years of scholarships, you may, upon graduation apply for a fourth and final year of scholarship assistance.

A Bachelor-Degree Church Work student applicant must:

1. Be a graduate of a Concordia University (LCMS).
2. Have completed a bachelor-degree church work program of the LCMS.
3. Have been an active member of a PSD Congregation for at least two years
4. Complete the Pacific Southwest District Scholarship Application Form.
5. Attach proof of graduation to your application.
6. Attach information on your loan with your application.

PSD SEMINARY SCHOLARSHIP

All seminary students currently attending Concordia Seminary, St. Louis; Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne; or the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center at CUI may apply for a PSD Scholarship Grant. This includes: Traditional on-campus students, Alternative Route, CMC, EIIT, Hispanic Institute, SMP, and Deaconess programs. Advanced degree programs (STM, DMin, or PhD) are not eligible.

Frequency: These are annual grants. A recipient is limited to a total of four grants.

Under the New PSD scholarship policy: It is permissible to apply for a PSD Seminary Scholarship while receiving a PSD Bachelor-Degree Church Work Scholarship. Please see the PSD website for more information.

An Applicant Must:

1. Be a student at a LCMS Seminary (St. Louis, Ft. Wayne, CUI-CMC),
2. Be enrolled as either a Traditional on-campus student, CMC, Alternative Route, EIIT, Hispanic Institute, SMP, or Deaconess.
3. Have been an active member of a PSD Congregation for at least two years
4. Complete the Pacific Southwest District Seminary Scholarship Application Form.

The PSD Seminary Scholarship Application Form, with proof of graduation, is to be completed and submitted to the office of the Pacific Southwest District President no later than June 3.

THANKOFFERING SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS OF PSD ROSTERED CHURCH WORKERS

Students who are children of Pacific Southwest District Rostered Church Workers and preparing for church work at a Concordia University may apply for *ThankOffering Scholarships*. These funds are from a special offering collected each year at the Lutheran Educators Conference. Use the link below to download the *ThankOffering* application. This grant is distributed while the student is attending school as an undergraduate.

2022 CHURCH WORKER LOAN REPAYMENT GRANTS

Each year, the Pacific Southwest District offers loan repayment grants for newly graduated called church workers *in the first three years of their first call* serving in the Pacific Southwest District. If you are a newly called pastor, teacher, DCE or other rostered church worker, consider applying for the 2022 grant. Additional information can be found on the PSD website.

Grants are determined annually with recipients of prior grants needing to apply each year during their eligibility period. The funds for this grant are made possible because of the Workers for the Harvest Endowment and the Student Loan Repayment Grant Fund. Individuals and congregations that wish to support future church workers through this grant may donate to either fund through the district office. Please list the fund you are donating to in the memo line.

REPORT FROM RACHEL KLITZING EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SCHOOL MINISTRY YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY REPORT

The District Youth Committee meets approximately four times a year, the past two years meeting remotely. **The District Youth Committee** plus several invited guests met at the District Office on Saturday, September 25, 2021. Using the SWOT analysis, Chairman **Seth Moorman** led us through a time of prayer, visioning, and tasks for the future of Youth Ministry in the Pacific Southwest District.

From this “retreat time” together, we developed the strategic goal for 2022: To encourage key ministry catalysts in our district to host five events that would connect thirty+ congregations to one another for the purpose of fellowship, mutual support, and Kingdom growth. Key leaders from around the district in each region were identified to be catalysts. Our Guiding Principles moving forward:

To **Retain** what the district does well
To **Remodel** what needs to be changed
To **Replant** ministry for the greater good of the Kingdom

The Greater Goal for the Committee: To mobilize the resources of the PSD to become a catalyst for ministry and support all who are serving in the areas of youth and family ministry (called, ordained, commissioned, lay). We asked key questions such as, “How can the district give legs to the congregation to do ministry with youth and families that hasn’t been done before?” This

could be accomplished by recruiting Ministry Catalysts/ Regional Champions and Ministry Liaisons/Ambassadors.

Ministry Catalysts could come alongside DCEs and lay workers and foster partnerships for activity in the areas of Youth and Family ministry and to encourage continuing education and professional growth. Ministry Liaisons/Ambassadors would connect with various ministries (churches, schools, RSOs, Circuit Visitors, etc.) to educate on how the district might be a support to ministry and to help break down the siloed aspects of ministry in the district. We will meet with Mark Siegert from Mission Training Center (MTC) and start dreaming of how a mutually beneficial partnership could develop for training and growth for leaders in congregations. We will also connect with Circuit Visitors to discuss ways to support congregations without DCEs.

The Pacific Southwest District was represented this past March at YouthLead (previously known as Lutheran Youth Fellowship -- LCMS) by four high school students, two adult leaders, and one college student. For the past four cycles of YouthLead Executive leadership, the western region has been represented by a teen/young adult studying church-work at Concordia University Irvine. This year, our own Adam Beadle of Risen Savior Lutheran Church in Chandler, AZ, has been elected to represent the western region

nationally at YouthLead for the coming 3 years. In addition to Adam, the PSD was represented by Ms. Victoria Lopez of Chandler, AZ, Ms. Ella Brinkman of Phoenix, AZ, & Mr. Aaron Duport of Orange, CA. God is at work in YouthLead as these young people spent the weekend investigating more deeply the doctrine of vocation and learning how to apply it in their everyday lives. At the end of the weekend, our students chose to debrief and plan for the future and have already taken initiative to plan a teen leadership retreat for the PSD this fall, patterned after the YouthLead model. We praise God for the drive he has given this group of teens that they desire to see the Spirit work in their peers here in our district and are excited to see that project to fruition. We are thankful for the district's financial support to make these trainings a reality.

From Ella Brinkman regarding her experience at YouthLead: *"YouthLead was an amazing experience to learn about our vocation and how God has called us into different roles in our lives. We also got to connect with other teenagers and be led through our sessions by them. Overall, it was very helpful, and we were able to get a lot out of our time there and build relationships with people across the country. Bringing it back to the PSD, we are hoping to do something very similar and provide those useful tools to high schoolers in our district. There are four highschoolers (Victoria, Adam, Aaron, and Ella) working to start something here, and we have great encouragement and support*

from our Youth Directors (Maddie Gong and Jill Lopez). We are hoping by mid-November to hold our first PSD YouthLead and bring teens together to connect and inspire them to be leaders back at their home congregations."

The LCMS Youth Gathering will be held July 9-13 in Houston, TX. There are over 500 PSD youth plus over 100 adult chaperones registered to attend as of this writing. **DCE Laura Bredehoft** (St. Paul's, San Diego) is serving as our PSD Coordinator for the Gathering. She received training this past summer in Houston. Information on the Gathering is being published in PSD E-News and in Connections, as well as on our social media channels. PSD youth and chaperones will gather for a tri-district rodeo and barbecue lunch following the Gathering at George Ranch in Houston.

We are tremendously blessed in the PSD to have **Steve Schedler** serve in a part-time role as DCE Liaison. In this role, Steve supports the important ministry of our DCEs throughout the district. Steve connects monthly with the DCEs, providing resources and encouragement to our Synodcially trained and certified DCEs and to those in congregations not certified but also serving in part- or full-time roles with Youth. Children or Family Ministry.

TO: Create a third pathway for general pastoral colloquy for members of LCMS congregations who have graduated with an accredited Masters of Divinity Degree from a Non-LCMS Seminary.

WHEREAS, God's Word call us to pray for additional workers in the harvest, "When he (Jesus) saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest;" (Matthew 9:36-37, ESV); and

WHEREAS, pastors of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are retiring in larger numbers than ever before and the number of men entering our seminaries is less than what is needed to replace these faithful servants and expand further mission and ministry; and

WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. James Baneck (add his position) in his August 2021 article, "Understanding the Church Worker Recruitment Initiative" wrote, "'Yet, we are not driven by fear but hope. We raise up workers in the church not to sustain institutions but to serve the church.'"

WHEREAS, the reformers write in *The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope* that the local church is granted the right of ordination, "(Christ) grants the power of the keys principally and without mediation to the church, and for the same reason the church has primary possession of the right to call ministers;" and

WHEREAS, the congregations of the Pacific Southwest District – LCMS give thanks to God and celebrate the various alternate routes to ordination and pastoral ministry available in the LCMS, such as Specific Ministry Pastors (SMP), there is a

growing need for general ordination pastors who are able to receive divine calls from congregations without restriction, provide supervision for other rostered church workers, supervise vicars, hold elected or appointed office on the district or national Synod level such as a Circuit Visitor, and vote as delegates at the Synodical conventions of the church; and

WHEREAS, there are pathways by which pastors, from church bodies outside the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, who meet specific criteria may secure admission to the ministerium of LCMS as general ordination pastors through Colloquy. This admission may be provided through a "colloquy" (discussion, interview) with the Colloquy Committee for the Pastoral Ministry; and

WHEREAS, The Policy Manual for Admission to the Pastoral Ministry of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod by Colloquy: Bylaws and Policies states that applicants for Colloquy must fit into one of two categories (the Colloquy Committee for the Pastoral Ministry is responsible for the final determination of the category in each individual situation):

1. Active Pastors from Other Christian Church Bodies: Men who, at the time of application are in good standing and in active service as pastors in another Christian Church body/denomination may apply for colloquy.

- 2 Men who have prepared for pastoral ministry but, at the time of application, are not in active service as pastors: Such applicants must be graduates of a program of study that leads

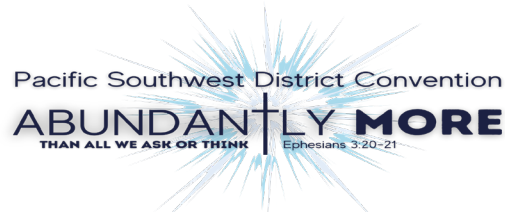

BYLAWS

1.0 DISTRICT OFFICERS

- 1.1 The district shall elect a president; first, second, third and fourth vice presidents; a secretary; a treasurer; and a circuit counselor from each authorized district circuit.
- 1.2 The district shall also elect:
 - A board of directors
 - A Church Extension committee chairperson
 - A committee on constitutions
- 1.3 Elected Officers
 - 1.3.1 No one in the district, or between the Synod and District, shall hold more than one elective office; or hold more than two offices, although one or both be appointive; or ever hold two offices of which one is directly responsible for the work done by the other.
 - 1.3.2 No one shall be elected to more than one district office.
 - 1.3.3 No more than two executive officers shall be elected from any one congregation. The executive offices shall be understood to include the president, the vice-presidents, the secretary, the treasurer, and members of the Board of Directors.
 - 1.3.4 The term of the office for all elected to district offices shall be three years.
 - 1.3.5 The offices of the president, the first vice president, the secretary, and the treasurer of the district shall be without limitation as to reelection.
 - 1.3.6 All other elected officers, members of the board, and elected committee members may serve a total of no more than three successive terms in the same positions.
 - 1.3.7 Any officer, member of the board, or elected committee member may be elected to his previous position after an interval of three or more years.
 - 1.3.8 Any officer or member of a board, ineligible for reelection, may be elected or appointed to any other position.
 - 1.3.9 All new officers, the board, and committees will assume their duties in the second month following the convention elections, and the current officers and the board shall continue to

serve until that time, except that members elected to the board of regents of Concordia University Irvine take office at the close of the district convention at which they are elected. (Synod Bylaw 3.2.4.)

1.4 Vacancies

A vacancy in the office of the presidency shall be filled by the first vice president

A vacancy in any vice presidency shall be filled by advancing the lower-ranking vice presidents. The remaining vacancy shall then be filled by the president from the nominees left after the previous election, according to the number of votes received.

1.4.1 A vacancy in the office of secretary or treasurer shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors.

1.4.2 A vacancy in the office of circuit counselor shall be filled by appointment by the district president.

1.4.3 A vacancy in any other office shall be filled by appointment by the district president in consultation with the appropriate body.

1.4 Procedures for Nominating and Electing

1.4.1 All officers shall be elected at each convention.

1.4.1.1 President

1.4.1.1.1 Nominations

1.4.1.1.1.1 Six months prior to the District Convention, the secretary of the district will request from all congregations of the district the nomination of up to two ordained ministers from the clergy roster of the Synod for the office of District President.

1.4.1.1.1.2 The candidates receiving the three highest total number of nominations who are willing to serve if elected shall be on the ballot for District President.

1.4.1.1.1.3 The biographical information of the three nominees as well as mission and vision statements from the candidates will be printed in the convention workbook for prayer and study by the delegates.

1.4.4 Board of Regents, Concordia University Irvine shall be elected in the following manner:

1.4.4.1 The district shall elect four members for the Board of Regents, Concordia University Irvine—one ordained minister, one commissioned minister, and two lay persons.

1.4.4.2 Members of the Board of Regents shall serve three-year terms, renewable twice.

1.4.5 The nominating and election procedures shall include the following:

1.4.5.1 Prior to each district convention each regional vice president shall appoint from his region at least two ordained ministers, two laypersons, and two commissioned ministers to stand for election to the District Nominating Committee. The District Convention shall elect from each region one pastor, one lay person, and one commissioned minister who shall serve on the 12-member Nominating Committee for the following District Convention. The committee shall choose its chairperson at its first meeting.

1.4.5.2 The committee shall elicit from all nominees for office, prior to the convention, an indication of their willingness to serve if elected. The slate of nominees, including the qualifications of each person nominated, shall be included in each convention packet, and these materials shall be mailed distributed to each lay delegate, pastoral delegate, and to each advisory member delegate and to each pastor at least one month before the convention begins.

1.4.5.2.1 Additions to the slate of nominees may be made from the floor by voting delegates, with the consent of the person so nominated.

1.4.5.3 The president shall appoint a committee of nine members—three pastors, two commissioned ministers, and four laypersons—to conduct and supervise all elections.

1.4.5.4 This committee shall have the privilege of the floor at the discretion of the convention chairman.

1.4.5.5 A majority of all votes cast shall be required to elect. The result of each ballot shall be announced to the convention.

2.0 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

2.1 Shall consist of sixteen members: the president, the four vice-presidents, the secretary, the treasurer, one layperson and one commissioned minister from each region and the chairperson of the LCEF Board.

2.2 Nomination

Six months prior to the District Convention, the secretary of the district will request nominations for all board positions with regional representation being achieved as follows: Each congregation in a region will be invited to nominate up to two people for commissioned minister and up to two lay people from their region. All who are nominated must be a member of a parish in their region. The individuals receiving

the four highest numbers of nominations from each region will be placed on the ballot for election by the entire convention.

2.2.1 If an elected member of the board ~~would move out of their region~~ *changes their membership to a congregation outside their region* during their term of office, ~~the position would be vacated~~ and a new candidate from the region would be appointed as outlined in the District By-laws.

2.3 The Board of Directors shall:

2.3.1 Develop policies to facilitate the efficient functioning of the district as it carries out its mission.

2.3.2 Be the legal representative of the district and the custodians of all property of the district, and it shall be responsible for the general management of the district, acting on its behalf, between conventions.

2.3.3 Employ ~~an Executive Team Leader~~ *a Chief Operating Officer* to carry out the administration functions of the district according to the policies established by the Board of Directors and under the direction of the district president.

2.3.4 Elect, immediately following each convention, a chairperson from the elected Boardmembers, and meet regularly according to its needs.

2.3.5 Approve or disapprove of all appeals for money of a general nature to be made to congregations or individuals, not previously authorized by the district.

2.3.6 Keep on file an accurate inventory of all properties, legacies, and other valuable documents of the district.

2.3.7 Be authorized to draw upon the district treasury for its expenses.

2.3.8 Be accountable to the District Convention for all its transactions. Any decisions of the board may be appealed to the District Convention.

2.4 Fidelity bonds shall be provided for the Treasurer, the ~~assistant to the treasurer~~ Chief Financial Officer, and other district personnel as determined by the Board of Directors.

2.5 The president and the secretary of the district shall be empowered and instructed to sign all legal documents in the name of the district. The treasurer shall be empowered to sign legal documents in the absence of the secretary, and the first vice president in the

absence of the president. *Other District personnel can be designated by the Board of Directors.*

3.0 DISTRICT CONVENTIONS

3.1 The district president shall be responsible for the organization of the District Convention.

3.2 The convention shall meet during the calendar year preceding the year in which there is a national synodical convention.

3.3 Convention Expenses

3.3.1 All congregations of the district shall be urged to include in their budgets the convention expenses of their respective pastors, commissioned ministers, and lay delegates.

3.3.2 All congregations of the district *are asked to include* in their budgets the assessment for convention general expenses as determined by the Board of Directors.

3.4 Reports and Overtures

3.4.1 Reports to the convention by district committees as well as overtures shall *be sent* to the district president.

3.4.2 The district president shall assign overtures to convention committees.

3.4.3 The Convention Proceedings shall be maintained as part of the permanent records of the district.

3.5 Convention Committees

Prior to the convention, the district president shall appoint floor committees. The district president shall name the chairperson. Each committee shall select its own secretary from its members.

3.5.1 The chairperson of each committee shall arrange for meetings to consider the reports and overtures assigned to it by the district president.

3.5.2 Each committee shall consult with the chairperson of appropriate committees, taskforces, and staff concerning ministry related to the committee's subject area.

3.5.3 Each committee shall submit its report and recommendations to the convention.

3.5.4 Additional convention committees shall be appointed by the district president as required.

4.0 DISTRICT CONFERENCES

4.1 All professional workers on the Synodical roster shall attend official conferences in accord with ~~synodical regulations~~ *Synod bylaw 4.8.2*.

4.2 All congregations of the district *are encouraged to include* in their annual budgets the conference expenses of their professional workers.

4.3 Conference for All Ordained Ministers

4.3.1 The Conference for All Ordained Ministers shall meet annually ~~in the fall~~ and be governed by its own procedures and bylaws.

4.4 Conference for All Commissioned Ministers

4.4.1 The Conference for All Commissioned Ministers shall meet annually ~~in the fall~~ and be governed by its own procedures and bylaws.

4.5 Joint Conference for All Ordained and Commissioned Ministers

4.5.1 A joint Conference for all ordained and commissioned ministers may be called at the discretion of the Conference for All Ordained Ministers and the Conference for all Commissioned Ministers.

4.6 Circuit Visitors' Conference

4.6.1 The Circuit Visitors' Conference shall meet twice a year.

~~5.0 PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, CIRCUIT COUNSELORS, SECRETARY, TREASURER, EXECUTIVE TEAM LEADER, AND REGIONAL MISSION FACILITATORS~~

5.0 DISTRICT OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE STAFF MEMBERS

5.1 The duties of the President, Vice Presidents, Circuit ~~counselors~~ *Visitors*, Secretary, and

Treasurer shall be as outlined in the Synodical Handbook except as supplemented in these Bylaws.

5.2 The Vice Presidents shall fulfill their responsibilities as directed by the President.

5.3 The ~~executive team leader~~ *Chief Operating Officer* is responsible for the overall administration of the Pacific Southwest District office, ~~the support, and coordination of the regional mission facilitators~~. The ~~executive team leader~~ *Chief Operating Officer* shall work under the direction of the District President. The general duties of the ~~executive team leader~~ *the Chief Operating Officer* are listed in the job description for the position.

5.4 ~~Regional mission facilitators~~ *The Executive Director of School Ministries, Mission and Ministry Executive and Chief Financial Officer* will serve ~~groups of the congregations and schools of the District by~~ effectively resourcing ~~them~~ *congregations and schools to* carry out their mission and ministry. These ~~facilitators~~ *Executive Staff members* are accountable to the District President for the administration of their positions.

5.5 The ~~regional mission facilitators~~ *The Chief Operating Officer, Executive Director of School Ministries, Mission and Ministry Executive, and Chief Financial Officer*, shall be given calls or contracts with a limited tenure of four years, *renewable* by the Board of Directors upon recommendation by the District President. *The four-year period begins July 1 in the year following each District Convention.*

5.6 *The Board of Directors, in consultation with the District President, may establish, hire, and call other Executive and Support Staff Positions as needed.*

6.0 FISCAL OFFICE

6.1.2 To receive all monies for budget and non-budget purposes of the district or Synod and issue receipts for the same.

~~7.1.2 The Circuit Forums shall examine the needs of the congregations within their circuits, and their general community, and relate these needs in a written format to the district president's office, at least two (2) months prior to the district Goal Setting Conference.~~

~~7.1.3 The Circuit Forum shall invite the district president, or a member of his staff, to attend one Circuit Forum meeting every three years in order to share the hopes and needs of circuit, the district, and the Synod.~~

~~7.2 Organization and Meetings~~

~~7.2.1 Each Circuit Forum shall consist of one pastor and one lay member from each congregation of the circuit. The circuit lay delegate to the Synodical Conventions shall function as an advisory member.~~

~~7.2.2 Additional officers, as required, shall be elected by the Circuit Forums.~~

~~7.2.3 The circuit counselor shall ordinarily serve as the chairman of the circuit forum, providing guidance, direction, coordination to the plans and programs, which the forum intends to implement.~~

~~7.2.4 The Circuit Forum membership shall be elected by the congregations in the year following the district convention.~~

~~7.2.5 The chairperson of each Circuit Forum shall be the presiding officer of all Circuit Forum meetings.~~

~~7.2.6.1 In the absence of the chairperson, the forum shall be empowered to appoint an acting chairperson from its membership.~~

~~7.2.6 Each Circuit Forum may appoint Standing Committees as needed.~~

~~7.2.6.1—As specific needs arise, additional standing committees may be

and as often as necessary to plan and implement programs.~~

8.0 STANDING COMMITTEES

8.1 Committee on Constitutions

8.1.1 The district shall elect a Committee on Constitutions composed of two
ordained ministers and one layperson.

8.1.2 All new and revised constitutions of the congregations of the district are to be
reviewed by this committee, in accordance with the synodical Bylaws.

8.1.3 The Committee on Constitutions shall examine the constitution and bylaws
of congregations to ascertain that they are in harmony with Holy Scripture,
the Confessions and the teachings and practices of the Synod in order that
any necessary changes may be made by the congregation before the
application is acted upon.

8.1.4 If at any time there is a disagreement between the committee and the
congregation applying for membership on any scriptural doctrine or Synod
policy that cannot be resolved by the district president or Board of Directors,
and if the Board of Directors denies the application, the district president shall
submit the application to the next convention of the district (Synod Bylaw 2.3.1
[c]).

8.1.5 The committee will also suggest such improvements in congregations and organizations constitutions and bylaws as will better serve the administration of their affairs.

~~8.2 Mission Committee~~

~~8.2.1 The Mission Committee shall consist of a representative from each region appointed by the district president in consultations with the region's vice president.~~

~~8.2.2 The committee shall assist the regional directors and vice presidents in enabling the congregations to carry out the mission activities of each region and the district.~~

8.2 District and Regional Mission Councils

8.2.1 The District Mission Council (DMC) shall consist of a representative from each region and each special affinity circuit (Affinity Circuits can be gatherings of specific culture pastors, groups reflecting similar ministry environments - large church or small church pastors, pastors engaged in church planting, etc.) appointed by the district president in consultations with the regional vice presidents and the district mission and ministry staff.

8.2.2 The District Mission Council (DMC) shall assist the district president and staff in setting the overall district mission strategy and equipping the Regional Mission Councils, circuits, local congregations, and schools to carry out the mission activities within the district in each region. The DMC will report on the status of all mission activity to the district president and board of directors.

8.2.3 The Regional Mission Councils (RMC) shall consist of a representative from each electoral and affinity circuit operating in the region. The RMC Chair shall be appointed by the district president in consultations with the local RMC members, regional vice presidents and the district mission and ministry staff.

8.2.4 The Regional Mission Councils shall assist the district president and staff in the local distribution of an annual budget allocation from the District Board of Directors. The RMC will provide ongoing encouragement and support to all grantees, connections to coaching and mentoring, as well as accountability for the proper use of funds. The RMC will report on the status of all mission activity to the DMC.

8.3 Church Extension Committee

8.3.1 The District Convention shall elect a chairperson who shall be a layperson. The remainder of the committee, ~~as at~~ a minimum, shall consist of *at least one ordained minister who is currently serving a congregation of the district who is a member of the Pacific Southwest District* and one representative from each region. Each is appointed by the ~~district president~~ *LCEF District Vice President* in consultation with the ~~region's vice president~~ *district president*. ~~All appointments are to be subject to consultation with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund vice president for the district.~~

8.3.2 The committee shall assist congregations by approving real estate loans in conformity with the policies of Lutheran Church Extension Fund.

~~8.3.3 The committee shall assist congregations by having developed and implemented a program to encourage individuals and congregations to participate and invest in the Lutheran Church Extension Fund.~~

8.4 Youth & Family Ministry Committee

8.4.1 The committee shall provide planning and leadership for district youth & family ministry events and training events/conferences.

8.4.2 The committee shall provide an avenue for youth selected for District ~~LYF (Lutheran Youth Fellowship)~~ *Youth leadership* positions to be involved in leadership experiences.

8.4.3 The ~~council~~ *committee* membership:

8.4.3.1 The chairperson shall be nominated by district staff and appointed by the District President.

8.4.3.2 One adult representative each from Arizona, Nevada and California be nominated by the ~~area DCE groups~~ *committee*.

8.4.3.3 Six high school youth, ~~selected recruited to district LYF youth committee positions through district youth ministry events or trainings~~

8.4.3.4 Project directors and coordinators, selected by the Youth & Family Committee, to serve as committee chair or coordinators for district youth activities.

8.4.4 The committee shall normally meet three times a year.

8.5 Committee on Stewardship

8.5.1 The District President shall appoint a District Committee on Stewardship to work in conjunction with the Synod's Department of Stewardship to assist and advise local congregations with the development and promotion of an adequate stewardship program.

9.0 TASK FORCES

9.1 Task forces may be developed for specific purposes at the discretion of the district president, regional mission facilitators, Board of Directors, or standing committees. Task forces function under the direction of the person or group that appointed them. The task forces may be regional or for the district as a whole.

9.2 Task forces should be chartered with a specific purpose and task and include a specific ending time.

10.0 PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

10.1 The Constitution and Bylaws of the Synod, the Bylaws of the District, any special rules of order the District may adopt, and the rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall govern the district as parliamentary authorities wherever in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the district may adopt, and in decreasing order of precedence as listed.

11.0 SPECIAL RULE OF ORDER

11.1 The following special rule of order shall apply to the proceedings in the district:

11.1.1 If a substitute motion is made and seconded the presenter shall be offered two minutes to provide the rationale for presenting the motion. The convention shall then first decide by majority vote without debate whether or not to consider the substitute motion. If the decision is in the affirmative and the substitute motion is subsequently adopted, the original motion fails; if the substitute motion does not receive favorable action either to consider or to adopt, the original motion is again before the convention.

12.0 AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS

12.1 These Bylaws may be amended as follows:

12.1.1 At a meeting of the District Convention by a majority vote provided that the amendment has been submitted in the Convention Workbook or in the Unprinted Reports and Overtures for that meeting and the delegates have a minimum of one night to review it. Prior review and approval by the Commission on Constitutional Matters will be required. When prior approval is not possible, actions taken will not become effective until and unless such approval has been obtained.

12.1.2 At a meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote upon the express direction of the District Convention to amend the Bylaws to implement a specific resolution adopted by the convention. Prior review and approval by the Commission on Constitutional Matters will be required. When prior approval is not possible, actions taken will not become effective until and unless such approval has been obtained.

12.1.3 *When necessitated by amendments to the Synod Constitution or Bylaws or otherwise expressly directed by a resolution of the Synod in convention, amendments may be made by a two-third's majority of the District Board of Directors. Such amendments shall be drafted by the District Secretary in partnership with the District Committee on Constitutions and shall be reviewed in advance by the LCMS Commission on Constitutional Matters.*
